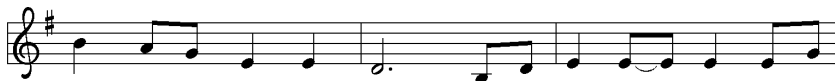

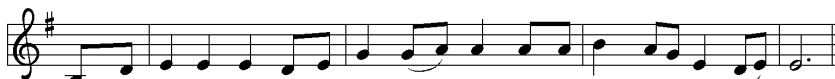

PRESENTATION

INVITATION TO COMMUNION


God keeps adding places to the table. Come to the banquet that has no end!






