Snow, snow stay away and come back another day. In 2008, Pope



Benedict told the people in Rome, "The Rosary, when it is prayed in an authentic way, not mechanical and superficial but profoundly, it brings, in fact, peace and reconciliation. It contains within itself the healing power of the Most Holy Name of Jesus, invoked with faith and love at the center of each "Hail Mary" (Pope Benedict XVI, May 3, 2008). Traditionally, October is the month of the Rosary, in memory of the help of the Blessed Mother during a time of great need. Many prayers are needed for our nation and the Church. We are living in very serious times, which require a whole-hearted response of prayer from each of us. "Whatever you ask the Father in my name, he will give it to you ... He prays without ceasing who unites prayer to works and good works to prayer. Only in this way can we consider as realizable the principle of praying without ceasing" (Catholic Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2745).

Recently, Pope Francis encouraged all Catholics to recite at the end of the rosary the prayer to St. Michael the Archangel composed by Pope Leo XII: "Saint Michael Archangel, defend us in battle, be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil; may God rebuke him, we humbly pray; and do thou, O Prince of the heavenly host, by the power of God, cast into hell Satan and all the evil spirits who prowl through the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen." The effort of participating in building up the Church and the local court entails a personal commitment of unity and charity and life in Christ. "Speak Lord, your servent is listening" (I Samuel 3:30).

over. It was a great convention. It is a rather awesome and overwhelming feeling to be a part of some 1200 Catholic Daughter members all together. They come as far as Guam, Puerto Rico, Texas, Maryland, Nebraska, New York, Minnesota, New Mexico, Iowa, and **North Dakota**. It was wonderful to have so many North Dakota delegates and members attending this convention!!

There were workshops preceding the opening of the convention. They were on such subjects as family, spir-

ituality, youth, leadership, legislative and membership. A terrific singer named Kathy Troccoli entertained and inspired us in the evening.

Our biggest task as a delegate was to listen. Knowledge and information from conventions inspires local courts. The sessions started with opening prayer. The Standing Rules were read and adopted. The Credentials Committee's report was adopted.

A discussion of the bylaws commenced. There were 27 proposed amendments! Fourteen were adopted. Approximately 5 were adopted with amendments added to the amendments. Five failed to be adopted.

We were reminded that we are made in the likeness of God, so we are **sacred** persons.

Father Maurer spoke of the reticence of young people to join organizations. People don't join organizations, they join people. Let your courts be homes. The ladies you want to recruit are not joiners. The people you want in your courts are not going to join an organization, they're going to join a court of community or a friend.

While there was a lot of business to cover, there also was some time for fun. North Dakota State night was ended by taking in the Purple CDA falls of Sioux Falls. Marvelous and beautiful are the words to describe them. On South Dakota Fun Night the Presidents of Mount Rushmore and their secret service agents delighted us with their presence. A DJ played great music and lots of members got their dance groove on!

There was lots of fellowship. New friends were made and reunions with old friends.

Then split up the roster between the committee members and call every member on the list to verify their

complete address, phone number, whether or not they have an email address. If they have email, what their email address is. So, if your court has 200 members you might want 10 or 15 or 20 members on the committee, if you have 40 members you may only need 3 or 4 on the committee. Talk it over at your first meeting and decide how many phone calls each committee member wants to make and find enough committee members to get the job done.

After you have done all the calling and updating, combine your information and send the changes to me and to the National Office. After that, I plan to compare National Rosters with mine, so that hopefully we will all have the same information. I know this is a big project, but it is very important, because we need to get our rosters up to date. We are spending a lot of money on each of our newsletters and only about half of our members are receiving them, so PLEASE help me get our rosters up to date!!!





September 19, 2018

Dearest Sisters in Christ,

I have tended my resignation from the position of 1st Vice National Regent as of September 30, 2018. After serving you for years on the national board, I feel a responsibility to share this decision as well as the reason with you before leaving.

I have felt the great privilege and responsibility that you have entrusted in me as a national director and then national officer of our sisterhood. I have taken seriously everything asked of me and tried to do so with a loving Catholic Daughter heart, giving my all for the good of our order and for my fellow sisters.

Olga's theme "Speak Lord, Your Servant is Listening" relates to my decision to step down. You see, when in San Antonio, Texas this week for a national board meeting and to celebrate our new National Regent with a Mass and Banquet, my heart was repeatedly touched by prayer and Mass reflections about becoming vulnerable in God's hands and allowing Him to lead me. I began to see how the way I have continued to serve as a national officer with such strenuous hours, demands, and travel (that is made increasingly more difficult due to medical issues)- putting the service of CDA above health, has been due to my sin of pride.

God put a vision on my heart while in San Antonio that helped me to see this more clearly and I would like to share that with you.

What I saw with my mind's eye was me as a little girl working diligently on something in my lap, while a caring man is near me, I feel him looking lovingly at me with a bit of a grin on his face. He gently tells me to hand this thing to Himthat He will take care of it. Without looking up, I keep working feverishly while declaring with childish determination "No, I can do it-I know I can".

He then gives a tender, loving, and amused smile- one that I have given myself to our children and grandchildren who are trying to do some silly thing like make it rain with no clue that they just don't have the power. He pulls me closer and tells me "No, you are aren't strong enough. But I will take care of it."

I was able to see clearly how I have been like that child-insisting I can do it despite how my health and strength have repeatedly told me differently. I have not seen how He has been trying to tell me to trust that He will take care of everything, Finally I can honestly say, Yes, *Lord*, *your servant is listening*. While I am at peace with the direction God is leading me, know that I will deeply miss being with you and serving you in this way as your National Officer, but I will continue to be a prayer warrior for our organization.

The bylaws of the order specifically outline the procedure when there is a vacancy in a national office and Olga will provide notice of the appointments in the future.
