The items that you need to keep your A running should be on your shelf, I think that you need to think a head and order before you need something. Recently water pumps, aluminum fans to name a couple items were out of stock from the suppliers. Times have changed.

For many years we were very fortunate to have an antique Ford parts dealer in our town. We can no longer run out and pick up that part we need. So now it's jump on the internet or get on your phone and order from out of state. The shipping costs are now an important part of the costs we face. What is even sometimes worse is due to supply issues some things are just not available. It's no secret that their are maybe six? larger players in this parts world who each make certain parts and sell them to their competitors. Each seems to make certain things so it does not make sense for everyone to create special tooling to make the same part. In the last few years sometimes things just are not availble and we wait for a parts manufacturing run to be made so we can finally get the item. Some of the one man shops that make these parts are retiring and it seems certain things are not being made.

Spread your purchases amongst as many of the suppliers as you can to help them make sales and have the opportunity to stay in business. If someone is slightly higher on an item consider buying from them . We need as many suppliers as possible.

We had a number of new members and first time visitors and they were introduced and told us what cars they have and what they would like help with.



## NEW PHOTO CONTEST FOR 2023


