Florida

Marijuana corporate giant Trulieve donated \$152.27 million to Amendment 3, shattering previous ballot measure campaign donations

Bipartisan opposition: Governor Ron Desantis, Florida GOP Congressional Delegation, Donna Shalala, and Patrick Kennedy

Best message: corporate monopoly and public use

Won by 4 points



Other States

South Dakota: Beat legalization by 11 points, rejecting pot for the second time

North Dakota: Beat legalization by 5 points

Massachusetts: Beat psychedelics legalization by 14 points, despite being a liberal state and being outspent more than 10-to-1



New Research

A study from the University of Western Australia discovered that marijuana is associated with significant increases in cancers, particularly breast, pancreatic, liver, thyroid, and testicular.

Testicular cancer risk rose 2.6 times among cannabis users.



Impact on Babies

Marijuana use among parents can lead to significant developmental abnormalities, including missing limbs, heart problems, and chromosomal disorders.

The cause? DNA mutations sparked by marijuana. "Micronuclear fragmentation" occurs, (chromosomes in micronuclei break into tiny fragments and are dispersed into the cell's main nucleus).



Impact on Babies

Among 663 stillbirth deliveries, women who had a stillbirth were twice as likely as those with a live birth to report having been addicted to an illicit drug. THC, the most common individual drug reported by the population, was found in 3% of women with a stillbirth



Cellular Aging

30% acceleration of cellular aging in users as young as 30 and clusters of major birth defects in areas with high cannabis cultivation



How Many Pregnant Women Use?

A new study from the University of Georgia found that about 6% of pregnant women reported using marijuana during the last month

Within that group, 70.9% perceived little to no risk associated with marijuana use during pregnancy

Two-thirds of the pregnant women who reported using marijuana lived in a state where medical marijuana was legal



Marijuana's effects on developing babies could include low birth weight, and other developmental problems - including fatal conditions

of marijuana dispensaries in Colorado recommended THC products to pregnant women
