Press deadline March 17, 2024 Exodus 15:22 • Then Moses led Israel from the Red Sea and they went into the wilderness of Shur. For three days they traveled in the desert without finding water.

Matthew 4:1 • Then Jesus was led by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil.

e have been hearing sermons on Israel and the Exodus while also in the season of Lent, leading up to Easter

Sunday. Both Israel and Jesus have seasons in the wilderness. In both instances, each was led into the wilderness. They did not "get lost" and find themselves there. People they trusted who listened



to God's will led them, and they

willingly followed their trusted leaders into the wilderness.

For some, the wilderness represents adventure. The idea of the unfamiliar excites, entices, and brings forth endless possibilities of what could be. For others, the wilderness signifies the strange and foreign. The unknown creates uncertainty, danger, and unpredictability. It is the same situation, but we interpret it in opposite ways.

I know many of us have been in these seasons of wilderness. We enter a season where we do not see how things will turn out, where we will end up, or what success looks like. I remember when Lydia and I entered a wilderness season that led to us leaving a ministry



behind and trying something new. It meant moving out of our home. I commuted to Los Angeles three days a week for three months, and we started a house church in our new apartment while I worked a few part-time jobs.

God led us, and we followed. We had no idea where this was going, what success looked like, or even how our provisions would be met. Years later, we can say that this wilderness season was one of growth, excitement, and, in the end, in a much better place than if we

stayed where we were! I would argue that I would not be the pastor at Trinity Church if we did not take this journey!

Maybe you have felt stuck, and God has challenged you to trust him and enter the wilderness. The plans are not all clear, with no clear time frame or even



what will be the end result. Do you trust that God will lead you with care and confidence?

Maybe you are in the wilderness and desire to return to where you started. After all, Israel wanted to return to Egypt and slavery! Do you trust God that this season will lead you to growth, prosperity, and a better understanding of who God is and what God wants you to do as his disciple?

The Israelites reached the land God had promised them.
Jesus fulfilled his ministry to completion and excellence. Do

you trust in God's promises for you, and that the wilderness God invites you into in order to follow him will bring you to a better place than you are today? Trust in God - he will lead you.


