To My Dear Brothers and Sisters at Dawson Covenant Church,

As I think back on God's faithfulness over this past year I am filled with Thanksgiving. As we continue to pursue God's mission in the world, we look back and see God's providence. Notably, we had the joy of welcoming Steven, Heather and Alexis into the church family and installing Steven as our director of Children, Youth,



and Family Ministry. Through the power of God, lives are continuing to be shaped and transformed by the Gospel. God's leading toward an emphasis on children, youth, and family ministry has been fruitful and continues to grow. May we continue to seek first His Kingdom as we head into this new year.

I have visited with many of you at your home, at church, the hospital and parsonage. I have ministered to some of you in times of sickness and grief. In addition to the ministry of the Sunday service itself, I have had the opportunity to teach Inquirers class, confirmation, Sunday school and youth group events. As a part of the Dawson-Boyd ministerium, I have had the privilege of doing services at the care center. This May also marks the completion of our 10th year since moving to Dawson. It is amazing how quickly the time has passed. When I remember our arrival with Gregory (who was not yet even one year old) it's stunning to see the transformation in our family and church. I want to specifically thank the church again for the many ways you have loved and cared for my family. We are so grateful for all the gifts of child care, financial provision, meals, materials, gestures of appreciation and kind words of encouragement. I am continually humbled by your kindness to us. You have been and are family to us, and we cannot fully articulate what a precious gift that is.

I want to thank you for all the ways you have served your church and the community over this past year. I want to thank those who have stepped up in various ways to help with ministry to our children, youth, and families. I want to thank everyone for the way that they love one another and for the warmth and kindness you show to those who come through our doors. One of the greatest ways I have seen God using our church is through the loving presence we represent to those we encounter, it matters greatly and is evidence of the Kingdom.

As another year passes, I am also aware of my own shortcomings and oversights -- even those I am not conscious of. Please accept my apologies. I sincerely ask for your forgiveness and encourage anyone to visit with me if there is a wound I have caused.

As we head into this new year together, we do so with great expectations. God is using this congregation in mighty ways to bless this community and shape lives! God has placed us here for His purposes. God has provided for us despite the economic headwinds. May we continue to trust God in all things and to dedicate ourselves to our shared ministry in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord.

Dear Church Family at Dawson Covenant Church,

This year has been an amazing year for my family and me. We accepted the position at Dawson Covenant Church. We moved to Minnesota and found an amazing church to serve with. Our goal has always been to serve God in any capacity He sees fit for us. With the help and leadership of Pastor Erik Carlson, our transition into ministry in Dawson has been a smooth one. I look forward to this coming year to see what God has in store for Dawson Covenant Church.



The past year has held several projects within the child and youth programs. One of the first things implemented was missions projects. A goal for the youth is to get them to be missional in heir faith. We began service projects to the cities during summer in preparation for our larger mission trips coming in the summer of 2020. The high school team will be going on a mission rip to Denver in June and the middle school team will be going to Sioux Falls for their mission trip in July.

Another change was to give the students ownership of the youth room. We added graffiti art on the wall in the hileague room and added a lounge area for students to sit and talk. We replaced the couches with chair seating to accommodate the growing group. We want the students to invite their friends, and additional seating ensures everyone is comfortable when joining in.

I meet with students on a regular basis for lunch. This gives students some real one on one time with me. It has helped me to encourage the students to start talking about their faith, and to make their faith personal. This has helped us build strong relationships with the students, and develop leadership skill for several students. As a result, students are beginning to help teach Sunday School with my help, support, and guidance. Having an opportunity to teach encourage students to understand biblical concepts more deeply and provides them another way to talk about their faith.

For Pioneer kids, we have started to reconfigure the room to better help students feel at home there. We added bean bag chairs which they love. We are also implementing new curriculum that is more user-friendly curriculum so that any adult can come in and teach without feeling lost. Our goal is to start getting these students in their Bibles and to grow a deeper understanding of God's word.

These are just a few of the things we started to implement into the ministry. This is, hopefully, the groundwork for the coming years. We would like to thank you all for your support and hope to continue building an amazing and strong youth and children's program.
