Press deadline February 18, 2024 1 John 4:9-10 • This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins.

ebruary 14th is a date we all know by heart – Valentine's Day. We all have memories of sending Valentine cards to classmates in school, receiving little candy hearts and chocolates from sweethearts, and flowers from loved ones. It is a day where red, pink, and white are



everywhere as we celebrate love in all its forms and fashions.

This year, February 14th is also another day of celebration. It is Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent.

In the traditional church calendar, Ash Wednesday marks approximately 40 days before Easter, often symbolizing the 40 days Jesus was in the wilderness. The idea is that we, as believers, prepare our hearts to receive the gift of salvation because of the cross and the empty grave. How can we receive the gift of forgiveness of sins if we do not recognize that we even sin and thus need forgiveness?

So, Lent is a season of preparation. We prepare our hearts for receiving the gift of salvation by recognizing our sin, the suffering coming out of that sin, and the need to reconcile it.

We then come to Easter and celebrate that Jesus paid the price for the sins we acknowledge and confess!

John himself said that God sent Jesus to be the sacrifice for our sins as an act of love. It is one thing for God to see a problem and send Jesus to fix it. It is another thing for God to send Jesus to

impress us all with how mighty both of them are, making it more of an act of their egos than our needs.

But none of those arguments are the reason. God sent Jesus to sacrifice himself for our sins because he loves us! This gift is more significant than any Valentine card or box of sweets one could ever give or receive. No human act of love could come close to the act of love God performed in sending Jesus to be our teacher, healer, leader, guide, friend, and Savior.

So, on February 14th, as we send Valentine greetings and cards to one another, prepare your hearts to receive



the greatest gift of love you could ever receive. As you do loving things for another, spend time with those you love, and say those magic words to a special person, realize the unlimited depth and width of God's love for you.

You receive a Valentine as a sign of someone's love for you. It is proof of their love. God's gift is so big that we spend 40 days preparing our hearts to receive this truth: the cross and the empty grave are God's proof of love for you.

MLK Day



Dress up Days


