

## WEEKLY THOUGHTS 24<sup>th</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME SEPTEMBER 12<sup>th</sup> 2021

Dear Friends, last Wednesday September 8<sup>th</sup> the Church celebrated the Birthday of Mary the mother of our Savior Jesus. Her birthday was the hope and day break of our salvation. This week is Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross- a source of our salvation to believers and a scandal to non-believers. There will be Mass on Tuesday to celebrate this feast at Holy Infant at 10.00 am.

There will be Mass on Wednesday September 15<sup>th</sup> to celebrate the Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows. It is actually a celebration of Mary's way of the cross- as Mary watched the suffering and passion of her son Jesus. Let us find encouragement through Mary as we face a series of crosses as we journey to eternity.

The Gospel Reading of this Sunday Mark 8: 27-35 Jesus question his disciples about who the people say Jesus is. They responded by repeating the common views of the day; John the Baptist, Elijah and one of the Prophets. Turning to them Jesus asks "What about you?" You are the Christ- the Messiah responded Peter.

Jesus continued to reveal the challenges facing him as a Messiah that sounded very strange form the expectations of the disciples. Jesus as a Messiah will suffer greatly at the hands of the Scribes and Pharisees. He will be rejected by the Religious leaders. He will be put to death. He will rise after three days.

Peter as best friend of Jesus expressed his opinion that he does not want his Messiah to face and go through such challenges. Jesus tells Peter to get out of his way or sight because he is an enemy or Satan. One has to embrace God's standards by choosing to do the will of God- the way of Jesus.

For one to belong to the kingdom of God, they must embrace the cross which is an essential part of Christian life. Requirement for true discipleship is denying oneself - that is surrender of one's will and life to God's purpose or plan. This leads to growth in Spiritual life and maturity. This is the way of life for the Saints.


