ROUTE 66 HARMONICA CLUB ANNOUNCES

2019 TOURS

As host for SPAH 2019, the Route 66 Harmonica Club has arranged two tours for your convenience and enjoyment.

Tour #1

NATIONAL COWBOY AND WESTERN HERITAGE MUSEUM AND ROUTE 66 TOUR Thursday, August 15, 9:00 AM - 4:30 PM Cost: \$50.00 per person

The National Cowboy & Western Heritage Museum, with more than 28,000 Western and American Indian artworks and artifacts is located in Oklahoma City. Museum collections focus on preserving and interpreting the heritage of the American West. The historical galleries include the American Cowboy Gallery, a look at the life and traditions of a working cowboy and ranching history; the American Rodeo Gallery, fashioned after a 1950s rodeo arena, provides a look at America's native sport; Frontier West Gallery exhibits some of the more than 4,500 artifacts. The Native American Gallery focuses on the embellishments that Western tribes made to their everyday objects to reflect their beliefs and histories; The American Firearms Gallery houses firearms by Colt, Remington, Smith & Wesson, Sharps, Winchester, Martin, and Parker Brothers. The museum also houses Prosperity Junction, an authentic replica of a turn-of-the-century Western prairie town.

A brief guided tour will be provided followed by free time to explore the museum on your own. Lunch (not included in the tour fee) is available at the museum restaurant. The tour bus will depart the museum at 2:00 PM for the return trip to Tulsa.

We will return along an historic stretch of Route 66 with brief stops at the Round Barn, a tourist attraction near Arcadia, which became the most photographed landmark on Route 66; and at Pops restaurant in Arcadia, a modern roadside attraction on Route 66 marked by a 66 feet tall neon sign in the shape of a soda pop bottle.

Tour #2

DOWNTOWN HISTORIC TROLLEY TOUR

Friday, August 16, 9:30-11:30 AM OR 1:30-3:30 PM (depending on interest) Cost: \$30.00 per person

Board the air-conditioned trolley at the hotel for a guided ride back in time through the six districts of Tulsa's historic downtown: Cathedral, Blue Dome, Tulsa Arts, Greenwood, East End Village, and the famous Deco District. See some iconic Tulsa landmarks along historic Route 66. Also, you will see the famous Church Studio - the recording studio of Leon Russell - where Willie Nelson, Bonnie Raitt, Eric Clapton, Freddie King, and Tom Petty recorded in the 70's. There will be a few stops where you will exit the bus for a brief walking tour of a local attraction.

The Trolley departs the hotel at 9:30 AM and returns at 11:30 AM. A second afternoon tour, departing at 1:30 PM and returning at 3:30 PM will be offered, depending on interest.
