

Accidents Happen

Note: All registrants are required to sign a Waiver of Liability prior to participating in the workshop. The forms will be provided at the start of the workshop.

Things to bring

1. If you do not already wear glasses, bring a pair of safety glasses to protect your eyes. There will be lots of activity and distractions in the workshop creating unfortunate opportunity for accidents.
2. Bring a thick garden or winter glove to protect your hand from a slipped knife. You'll be required to hold the rootstock in one hand while cutting with a knife in the hand of the other. Improper technique without proper protection is a recipe for disaster.
3. Bring a sharp budding or grafting knife if you have one. A short bladed, non-curved paring knife can be used instead. A very thin-bladed pocket knife will work for grafting, but be a bit more difficult for budding. In any case, the blade must be stiff, not flexible. We have a few budding/ grafting knives to share, so if you come without a suitable knife, you are welcome to use one of ours but be prepared to share it with others. Inexpensive budding/grafting knives can be purchased online at any number of nursery catalog sites.
