Here's the "big three" for me:

1. Stephen Ministry. This is my number one highlight. It took many dedicated people, putting in a lot of time and effort, along with the financial support of the entire congregation, to reach the point of commissioning 11 Stephen Ministry Ministers. Thank you to everyone who has and/or is still supporting and participating in this Christian care-giving ministry.

2. Getting the sanctuary roof repaired before internal damage occurred. This could have resulted in a major problem, but through the prompt action of several people, the necessary repairs were finished quickly. Thank you to those who handled this so well.

3. Closing TYS preschool and associated programs. Not a highlight! This decision was by far the toughest and most emotional we had to deal with this year. There were many others, and your "big three" are probably different from mine.

Thrivent informed us that, at this time, we are not qualified to refinance our mortgage, and this has left us with a bare-bones-deficit budget. The newly elected Council will be greatly challenged to find a way to overcome this burden. Although this is serious, our focus will remain on the many wonderful ministries that take place here at Trinity. We all pray that God will continue to bless us with new ways of reaching out to each other and our community sharing His love. Thank you to everyone who participates in these ministries and especially to those who offer their time and effort to lead, facilitate and/or support them.

There is always some ministry waiting for you. Some way for you to participate by attending, learning or serving. Maybe that particular ministry is nonexistent and is waiting to be created. 2017 could be the year for spiritual growth for you and Trinity through ministry.

Trinity's future is as promising as WE make it. Notice the WE. What can WE do to keep God's message moving forward? Is it teaching children? Spending more time with the scriptures or in attending Bible Study? Participating in a special group activity? Serving in worship or helping with building maintenance? Choir? Outreach and Care Ministry

Missions

As we discussed last month, Trinity tithes 10% of general giving to four different Missions each quarter. The money is divided equally between FOMM (Friends of Madagascar Missions), ELCA World Hunger, COOL Ministries, and LSSI (Lutheran Social Services of Illinois).

Last quarter we discussed FOMM, and Bob Jemc spoke of the Mission trip he and our former interim pastor, David Lerseth, took in the fall of 2016. This quarter our emphasis is on ELCA World Hunger. (ELCA.org/hunger)

In the United States, our gifts to ELCA World Hunger help support the work of Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services, work that is achieved through a network of 28 local organizations in 26 states, most of which are Lutheran social ministry organizations. Also, our gifts help support more than 300 programs, that help our sisters and brothers move from hunger to wholeness. These include pay-as-you-can restaurants, food pantries and meal programs.

According to the ELCA, climate change and conflict and crisis put many of the world's 2.5 billion smallholder farmers at risk of extreme poverty. Long term sustainability requires innovative approaches to agriculture, disaster-risk reduction and advocacy.

Stewardship Program –

"Growing in God's Grace"

As you read in the Council President's letter in the beginning of this newsletter, Trinity has a bare-bones deficit, as Thrivent informed us that, at this time, we are not qualified to refinance our mortgage. You can help with this deficit by returning your Faith Giving Card, provided in the Stewardship mailing last November. As of January 22, we had 69 Faith Giving Cards returned, totaling about \$170,400. Cards and envelopes are available at the Welcome Desk, or from the church office, and can be completed and returned to the church office, or placed in the offering plate. Consider electronic giving through Thrivent's Simply Giving Program. Check our website for the authorization form, or pick up a copy at the Welcome Desk and follow the instructions. We had 4 members take advantage of this convenient method of giving for 2017, which brings the total to 9 members. Remember, what you give is between you and God, and it helps Trinity plan for His work in 2017. We thank you for your participation.
