April is Child Abuse Prevention Month - The Diocese of Harrisburg is committed to the safety of children. We take very seriously the protection of youth in all Church related activities and programs. We are working to make the Catholic Church one of the safest institutions in the country.

To report the suspected abuse of a minor you must notify both law enforcement and the Church. First, call the PA Child Abuse Hotline at 1-800-932-0313. To report suspected abuse of a minor by a Church official, employee or volunteer, no matter when it happened, call the diocesan toll free hotline at 1 (800) 626-1608. In the Diocese of Harrisburg we:

- Have zero tolerance for anyone who is guilty of even one instance of abuse.
- Offer opportunities to help victims to heal.
- Screen all employees and volunteers before they can begin service.
- Educate our youth on how to stay safe.
- Train employees and volunteers on how to recognize and report abuse.
- Disclose all allegations to local civil authorities.
- Exceed State and national requirements.
- Undergo an annual independent audit of our procedures.

Dear Parishioners, March 27, 2018

Jesus Christ is risen today! Happy Easter to you and your family!

Here is an update regarding Catholic Campus Ministry at Shippensburg University:

- 1. <u>Roxanne Dennis' Retirement</u>: Roxanne Dennis, who has been the Associate Director of Catholic Campus Ministry for over 20 years is retiring in June. Roxanne has been and continues to be an excellent example of Catholic faith and living to the students of Shippensburg University and the Penn State Mont Alto campus (where she also had served at one time). I am grateful to the Lord for the diligence, authenticity, and passion with which Roxanne has ministered here in Shippensburg. She has benefited not only the campus ministry, but also our parish. Thank you so much Roxanne!
- 2. <u>New Campus Minister</u>: We have received 43 resumes for the position. The Search Committee is working hard to discern which candidates should be interviewed. Judging by the resumes, there are many fine candidates for the position! Pray for me and the search committee to find the best candidate for the position. It will not be an easy decision. In the beginning of May, I will be making a job offer to the top candidate. By mid-June, we will have a new campus minister.
- 3. <u>FOCUS</u>: Back in the fall, I preached a homily in which I disclosed to everyone my dream of bringing the Fellowship of Catholic University Students (FOCUS) to Shippensburg University. FOCUS has a proven track record. I encourage everyone to learn more about them by visiting their website www.focus.org. After months of discerning, consulting with the diocese, our parish finance council, and FOCUS representatives, it has become clear that 2018 is not the right time to pay for FOCUS missionaries to come to Shippensburg. The FOCUS representative said that they would probably not be able to send us anyone this year.

Nonetheless, our relationship with FOCUS is growing. Our students are attending national conferences and beginning to use Bible study materials that FOCUS provides. We are able to benefit from their evangelistic spirit even without spending \$60,000 to bring full time FOCUS missionaries to campus.

Once when I went to Confession recently, the priest gave me this advice: "Life by the yard is hard. Life by the inch is a cinch." We are still excited about bringing FOCUS to Shippensburg, but we will do it "by the inch" rather than "by the yard."

I am so fortunate to serve as pastor here in Shippensburg and as Catholic Campus Minister at the University. Thank you for all of your support for me, the parish, and the CCM. May God bless you all! Have a happy Easter!
