

**Minutes of Regular Meeting
Liberty Township, Licking County, Ohio
March 9, 2020**

- The regular monthly meeting of the Liberty Township trustees held on Monday, March 9, 2020 in the Liberty Township House. Bill Siegel, township trustee, called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. He stated the meeting is being recorded, and then led the Pledge of Allegiance.
- Roll call taken with the following answering as present: Bill Siegel, Bill Bogantz and Dave Cole.
- Motion made by Bill Bogantz to approve the regular meeting minutes from February 10, 2020. Motion seconded by Dave Cole and passed with all yes votes.

Zoning Report

- Zoning Commission:
Bill Bogantz, trustee, made a motion to accept the nomination of the Zoning Commission of Fred Schwartz to serve as the committee chair. Dave Cole, trustee, seconded the motion. The motion passed with all yes votes.
- Zoning clerk, zoning inspector and trustees discussed the formation of a Zoning Resolution Committee. Public Notice is required for residents interested in sitting on this committee. The committee will require one township trustee, two township residents and two members from each zoning board and they agree to meet monthly.

Resident/Public Input

- Vince Crawford, Waste Management, attended the meeting. He spoke about the number of residents that use the recycling option. Only 82 out of 818 customers subscribe to the recycling. Their trucks are close to being fully automated to help with employee injuries.
- Mr. Angelletii requests any help the township could give him in regards to his safety while backing in his driveway located on Nichols Lane. After discussion, Jeff Irvin, Road Maintenance Supervisor, will install new Hidden Driveway signs to attempt to slow traffic.
- Ray Hetterscheidt questioned the openings on the Zoning Boards. The trustees stated they have been asking township residents and no one has been interested in filling the openings.
- Township resident questioned mowing for proper sight off of Liberty Court to Northridge Road. Bill Siegel will check on this with the county.
