PLAYGROUND CLOSURES

As part of ongoing efforts to help prevent the spread of COVID-19, the Summer Village of Silver Sands has CLOSED ALL PLAYGROUND STRUCTURES located in the Summer Village. The closures are in effect until further notice.

A reminder to individuals and families utilizing the walking paths and park reserve areas, which remain open at this time, that social and physical distancing practices are required.



RETURNING FROM TRAVEL

MANDATORY ISOLATION ORDER IS IN EFFECT

Travellers and close contacts of confirmed cases, you are legally required to isolate for 14 days if you:

-returned from travel outside of Canada after March 12, or are a close contact of a person who tested positive for COVID-19 (provides care, lives with or has close physical contact without appropriate use of personal protective equipment, or comes into direct contact with infectious body fluids)

-become sick with cough, fever, shortness of breath, runny nose or sore throat during this ou must isolate for an additional 10 days from the beginning of symptoms or until you are feeling well, whichever takes longer.

There may also be supply-chain issues to consider. Retailers across the country have found it difficult to keep food, cleaning supplies and other highly-demanded products on their shelves. For stores in remote areas that are used to serving small populations at this time of year, a sudden influx of cottagers can make
