First Reading: Isaiah 8:23 - 9:3

In the Galilean country, the people have seen a great light.

In days past the Lord humbled the land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali, but in days to come he will confer glory on the Way of the Sea on the far side of Jordan, province of the nations. The people that walked in darkness has seen a great light; on those who live in a land of deep shadow a light has shone. You have made their gladness greater, you have made their joy increase; they rejoice in your presence as men rejoice at harvest time, as men are happy when they are dividing the spoils. For the yoke that was weighing on him, the bar across his shoulders, the rod of his oppressor, these you break as on the day of Midian.

The Word of the Lord

Responsorial Psalm: Ps 26:1,4. 13-14. R. v.1 **R**/ The Lord is my light and my salvation. **Second Reading:** 1 Corinthians 1:10-13, 17

I appeal to you my brothers and sisters, make up the differences between you.

I appeal to you, brothers, for the sake of our Lord Jesus Christ, to make up the differences between you, and instead of disagreeing among yourselves, to be united again in your belief and practice. From what Chloe's people have been telling me, my dear brothers, it is clear that there are serious differences among you. What I mean are all these slogans that you have, like: 'I am for Paul', 'I am for Apollos', 'I am for Cephas', 'I am for Christ'. Has Christ been parceled out? Was it Paul that was crucified for you? Were you baptised in the name of Paul? For Christ did not send me to baptise, but to preach the Good News, and not to preach that in the terms of philosophy in which the crucifixion of Christ cannot be expressed.

The Word of the Lord

Gospel Acclamation: Mt 4:23

Alleluia, alleluia! Jesus preached the Good News of the kingdom, and healed all who were sick. Alleluia!

Gospel: Matthew 4:12-23

He went to Capernaum, that the prophecy of Isaiah be fulfilled.

Hearing that John had been arrested Jesus went back to Galilee, and leaving Nazareth he went and settled in Capernaum, a lakeside town on the borders of Zebulun and Naphtali. In this way the prophecy of Isaiah was to be fulfilled: Land of Zebulun! Land of Naphtali! Way of the sea on the far side of Jordan, Galilee of the nations! The people that lived in darkness has seen a great light; on those who dwell in the land and shadow of death a light has dawned.

From that moment Jesus began his preaching with the message, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand.' As he was walking by the Sea of Galilee he saw two brothers, Simon, who was called Peter, and his brother Andrew; they were making a cast in the lake with their net, for they were fishermen. And he said to them, 'Follow me and I will make you fishers of men.' And they left their nets at once and followed him.

Going on from there he saw another pair of brothers, James son of Zebedee and his brother John; they were in their boat with their father Zebedee, mending their nets, and he called them. At once, leaving the boat and their father, they followed him.

He went round the whole of Galilee teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the Good News of the kingdom and curing all kinds of diseases and sickness among the people.



Follow Me!

The first part of today's Gospel places Jesus' ministry in the context of the writings of the prophet Isaiah. Matthew identifies Jesus as the Messiah sent to be the light of God's revelation to the Gentiles.

The precious light of day shining through a window in these summer mornings reminds us of Jesus 'the light of our world'. In Jesus, 'the people that walked in darkness have seen a great light'. We are among those favoured people and it started with our Baptism. Ever since, Jesus has been shining on us his light of faith, hope, and

Hearing of the Baptist's imprisonment, Jesus moves to Galilee to begin his public ministry as the Light of God proclaiming: "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near". The time had arrived for God, who was really never far from His people. to come to reveal in Jesus God's true, fatherly relationship to us.

Everything that we can say about Jesus the man we can say about God the Father, who is one with Jesus. Jesus is our friend, so is the God our Father. Jesus is honest,

loval and faithful, so is God our Father. Jesus is welcoming, forgiving and generous. Jesus is loving and accepting, so is God. Jesus lays down his life for others: so does God in Jesus. Jesus is the human face of God.

Jesus bears the truth we are searching for: that God dwells among us, and is the fullness of love. Jesus brings us hope that we can turn away from sin and walking in his footsteps, come to the God who loves us and longs for us. Jesus is the peace and strength we crave for, to calm our troubled minds and heals our divided hearts. If only we let him, we can experience him lighting up our lives as our Way, our Truth, and our Life.

But Jesus does not force himself into our

lives. We must open ourselves to the Light that he offers us. There are people not far away living in the darkness of ignorance, prejudice, illness, loneliness, poverty, rejection, bitterness, moral confusion, sadness, guilt and grief. By virtue of our Baptism, Jesus is sending us to bring his light to them with the challenge: 'Recognise me for the good news that I bring and the good news that I am.' (Fr Brian Gleeson CP)

Sunday of the Word of God

Pope Francis has announced the third Sunday in Ordinary Time, January 26, as a day for "the celebration, study and dissemination of the Word of God". It is be-



ing called The Sunday of the Word of God. This day is intended to bring awareness of the importance of God's Word and how it can open our hearts and minds to love and mercy.

At the Second Vatican Council, the bishops wanted to say something about who God is and how we know who God is. In its document on divine revelation, Dei Verbum, the Second Vatican Council said that we know who God is because God enters into a relationship with us. Instead or learning facts about God, the council challenged us to know God. God takes the initiative to enter into a personal, loving relationship with us. It is through that encounter that we come to know who God is. The way that God enters into that personal, loving relationship with us is through the gift of God's word. What is the "Word" of God?

"Word" means a lot in this context. Pope Benedict VXI wrote about all the different ways we understand the "symphony of the word" (see Verbum Dei);

Logos—the cosmic dimension of God's word;

Creation—God's word as the enactment of the divine Image;

Reality—"The word of God makes us change our concept of realism: the realist is the one who recognises in the word of God the foundation of all things" (Verbum Dei, 10);

Christ—"[Jesus's] unique and singular history is the definitive word which God speaks to humanity" (Verbum Dei, 11).

Tradition and Scripture—"The word of God is given to us in sacred Scripture as an inspired testimony to revelation; together with the Church's living Tradition, it constitutes the supreme rule of faith" (Verbum Dei, 18).
