# News & Notes

Hello, everyone ...

I saw a nice essay in a UU book put together by Elizabeth Montgomery called "100 Meditations". This story is called "A Baptism" by Rev Robert R. Walsh published in 1992 in a book *Noisy Stones*. Here goes:

She called to ask if I would baptize her infant son.

I said our ceremony is like a baptism, but not exactly ... and we normally do it for people who are already part of the church family. And I said the next one is scheduled for May. She said "Could we come to talk with you about it, anyway?"

They came to see me ... the very young woman and her child, and the child's very young father. She explained that the child had been born with a heart defect, and he needed to have a risky heart operation soon. She had asked her own clergyman if he would baptize her son, but he refused because she was not married to the baby's father.

I told them that being unmarried would not be an impediment to anything we might do. But, I explained that our "child dedication ceremony" still might not be what they were hoping for, because:

- (1) Our ceremony does not wash away any sin.
- (2) Our ceremony does not guarantee the child a place in heaven.
- (3) Our ceremony doesn't even make the child a member of the church.
- (4) In fact, our ceremony doesn't change the child at all. We expect it will change *the rest of us* in our relationship with the child, and perhaps with all children.

She listened patiently. Then she said "**All I want to know is that a Greater Spirit blesses my baby.**" I gasped at the sudden clarity. With a catch in my throat, I said "We can do that." And we did.

I'm no religious scholar, but I know what I like. I've heard UU described as a "non-PROPHET" organization. In the story above, I imagine the young mother was turned-away by a "for-PROPHET" organization, because they have rules, you know. I think we have heart, instead.

Another one of the 100-meditations is from Euripides (Athenian poet and playwright) who talks about Prophets.

- It's easier to pay homage to prophets than to heed their vision.
- It's easier to venerate saints than to heed their human qualities.
- It's easier to glorify heroes than to live by their examples.
- It's easier to make earth-gods of the wise than to learn from their wisdom.
- Great leaders are honored when others share their insights and values.
- The grandchildren of those who stoned the prophet sometimes gather-up the stones later to build the prophet's monument.

According to Wikipedia (!), Euripides was a contemporary of Socrates and both were criticized as "decadent intellectuals". Socrates was eventually put on trial and executed as a corrupting influence. Euripides chose a voluntarily exile in his old age. It's risky to be a prophet, often misunderstood and unappreciated! And it's sometimes hard to be a UU ... so many pathways to choose from, and only your conscience to guide you! Maybe OIF can help!
