Alignment Check

Fall is here! This time of year often acts as a reset for many families as they put aside the carefree days of summer and get "back to normal" in the routines of school and family life. The season often becomes marked by a routine to focus and consistency. Using this same thinking, it's also often the time when the church does some examinations of ourselves. We encourage everyone "back to church" and set about on the routines of small groups, Sunday School, and Bible study.

I have been blessed to serve this congregation for over three years now. When I arrived here the church had gone through two seasons of relatively short pastorates. Many people in the church had stepped up, lead, and guided the church in those uncertain times. I remember gathering town hall style meetings to try to answer some simple questions about Trinity. "What has God uniquely called Trinity to do? What is our passion and purpose given from God?"

It's already been amazing to see how those conversations have fueled our ministry. Sparks of ideas from those days have inspired us to return to Sunday School, resume Adult Sunday School, and invite the community to our VBS programs. Ideas from those meetings changed the emphasis we put on our Benevolence giving, now committing more than ten percent of our operating budget to missions each year. Prioritizing a few building projects like more handicap accessibility and air conditioning were discussed at those meetings. We've accomplished a lot.

But this isn't where we sit back and say job well done. This is when the work truly begins. The honeymoon is over from our "new phase" together. After three years it's time again to ask, what is our purpose? This question can be answered both personally and congregationally.

YOU HAVE A PURPOSE. God has given YOU specific and unique gifts in order to be a part of the good work God is doing to seek and save lost people. Some are teachers, some are preachers, some have admin skills, some are encouragers, some are compassionate care givers, some are given wisdom, some are given knowledge. But each person and their gift are vital to the Kingdom of God

All of them will take care of one another. 26 If one part suffers, every part suffers with it. If one part is honored, every part shares in its joy. 1 Corinthians 12:25-26

As a congregation, we need each other! We are better when we have many different spiritual gifts and use them collectively for God's kingdom. When we work together, acknowledging that one is a better care giver while another is a better admin, we can use these gifts to compliment each other.

Our congregation, and congregations like us, can often fall victim to the "warm body burnout." What I mean is this, someone comes into the church and wants to serve. The church has existing ministries that it cares about, the new person wants to help so they plug in to fill the void. All we need is a "warm body" to help. They might not be passionate or gifted by God in that area, but it's the place they can help! Except it doesn't feed their spirit or match their calling. Eventually they find themselves burnt out, tired, and not wanting to serve at all. They might end up saying things like "I did must time" as if church exprise ware a price and not wanting to serve at all. like "I did my time" as if church service were a prison sentence! Sound familiar? What if, instead, we found people with their unique spiritual gifts and passions and let them use their calling from God! What if we realigned our ministry to take advantage of our passions and giftedness. You might find serving doesn't feel like "work" at all. You might find yourself happy to be aligned with a vision. You might be happy to be a part of what God is doing. You might find a purpose as a congregation, as well.

This is how we are designed to operate. But just like your car or your back might occasionally need an adjustment, so does your spiritual life. So does the church. We're going to use this season to call ourselves back to our purpose, back to our joy, back to our God given mission, and I pray we will find the answer "What has God uniquely called and equipped Trinity to do?" For His kingdom and His glory! Amen!

People go about making their plans, but the Eternal God has the final word. Even when you think you have good intentions, He knows your real motives. Whatever you do, do it as service to Him, and He will guarantee your success. The Eternal God made everything for a reason. -Proverbs 16:1-4 (The Voice)

CAN YOU TEACH ME HOW TO PRAY?

This month we sat down with Matej (who we met in May, and has been reading the Bible for the first time in his life) and as we were talking he asked my coworker and I, "Can you teach me how to pray?" It's pretty rare that a student asks a question to us almost verbatim to that which the disciples asked Jesus, so we turned to Luke 11 to see how Jesus answered. As we talked Matej observed how Jesus likened God to a good father, who desires to give good gifts, and we talked about how we can talk with God in prayer.



He committed to praying once daily at night. That night he prayed for the first time, and he said he prayed for bigger life things, for future job, wife, etc. When he woke up he was sick for the next 3 days! We talked to him about spiritual warfare, and how the enemy wants to keep him from knowing and having a relationship with God! It was so clear that this was the work of the enemy to discourage him from prayer. Though despite that, he said being sick reminded him to pray more "daily bread" prayers, for things more simple like health each day, thankfulness for weather and being able to go for walks with his dog. In the end he said it was encouraging for him in prayer, and it was good for us to be able to discuss the challenges of spiritual warfare.

Pray for Matej, that he would continue to discover God through His word, that the enemy would be powerless to blind him from seeing and recieivng the truth. Pray that he would be faithful in prayer, to pursue God and His will in his life. Pray that he would find openness in the people around him, that he could start a group of people who want to read the word with him, people he can share his excitement for the Bible with.
