Grace & Peace from the Pastor's Desk

When I was a child... there was a Boy Scout Camp near Erie known as Camp Sequoia.

According to Evelyn Baker who reported on the camp, it was named for Sequoia, a Cherokee Indian born in 1770, to a white English father, George Gist or Guess, and an Indian mother, Wureth, of the Paint Clan.

Sequoia is credited with development of a Cherokee written language and furthered the education of the Cherokee Nation

(https://sites.rootsweb.com).

It had a totem pole and a cross shaped mess hall, and my memories are a group of us, trying to link hands around a giant pine tree that I thought was a sequoia, but I couldn't find any record of such a tree on the property.



I bring up the subject of the Sequoia because I came across an article in Homiletics.com regarding the General Sherman Sequoia, a giant sequoia tree. It is not one of the tallest, widest nor oldest living trees ever, but it is 275 feet high, 25 feet in diameter and about 2,300-2,700 years old. With total volume of 52,513 cubic feet, it is the largest known living single-stem tree on the planet.

Trees are an amazing part of nature and of our faith. They are mentioned in the first and the last chapters of the Bible, and many times in between. We find "the tree of life" In Genesis 2:9, and again in Revelation 22:19. This is not the tree that Adam and Eve were instructed not to eat of, that was the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil. The first chapter of the book of Psalms begins by speaking of a "tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not whither" (Psalm 1:3 NIV). John the Baptist said that unfruitful trees would be "cut down and thrown into the fire" (Matthew 3:10 NIV). And the death of Jesus on the cross is sometimes spoken about as "hanging on a tree" (Galatians 3:13). We even sing about trees at Christmas and bring them (or an artificial substitute) into our homes. It is said the tradition of a lit fir tree was started by Martin Luther to demonstrate to his children how Jesus left the stars of heaven to come to earth.

Our trees are now in full bloom, and we can recognize the life-giving system of photosynthesis which feeds the tree and gives us oxygen. This reminds us that the tree has a strong base, a flexible build, beauty, and a purpose. As Christ followers, we too have a strong base in Jesus, the ability to stand up to hardships without breaking, the beauty of character and a purpose to share the Good News of Jesus.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

Thank you so very much for your financial donation to Holy Trinity ministries. The \$528.00 donation has been placed into our Food Ministrics Program Fund. When the pandemic arose, we switched our worship to a tele-conference each Sunday morning at 11:30 am and have continued that for the ensuing months, as we continue to focus our care for one another and do not yet feel it is safe for our members to gather in the sanctuary. We are blessed that we have approximately 30-40 of our members who dial in each Sunday, as well as 12-15 people each week in Wednesday tele-conference Bible Study.

We have been able to continue our food ministry. When we were last working in "normal mode" the soup kitchen served approximately 7375 meals and the Food Pantry distributed 1725 bags of groceries in 2019. With your support we are able to continue serving in God's ministry to help feed body and spirit with a good meal and fellowship.

During this time of pandemic, we continue to provide food through the Feeding America – Second Harvest Food Bank program, in association with Country Fair, Sheetz, Panera and Giant Eagle-Yorktown. These stores generously donate their excess foods and we use these donations to prepare bagged lunches with prepared foods for a day or 2, lunch meat and cheese, bread, milk, desserts, and fresh fruit every Wednesday and Saturday. We average a distribution of about 50-60 bags per week to our friends and neighbors, and have distributed bags to over 6800 persons. Your donation will help to enable this outreach, as we continue to deal with the COVD-19 pandemic.

Holy Trinity members and the many volunteers from our ecumenical partners, offer loving hearts and helping hands, but only with support from people like you through prayer and contributions is it possible to fulfill God's mission with our neighbors in need.

Help Needed - Our Friends, the Pollinators

Have you eaten a meal lately? Your meal was most likely provided in part by pollinators. Pollinators are essential to about 80% of the crop plants grown around the world.¹

A pollinator is anything that helps carry pollen from the male part of a flower or blossom (stamen) to the female part of the same or another flower (stigma). Pollinator animals include bees, wasps, moths, butterflies, birds, flies, and small mammals, including bats.²

Many pollinator populations are in decline due to pollution, the misuse of chemicals, disease, and changes in climatic patterns.³ We need to help them and certainly avoid harming them.

Refer to Penn State Extension's "Planting Pollinator-Friendly Gardens."⁴

- Choose plants native to your region, and avoid modern hybrids.^{5,6}
- Choose nectar- and pollen-rich flowers with a range of shapes, sizes, and colors. Check with Penn State or a nearby Master Gardener for guidance.
- Have several different plants in bloom from early spring through late fall.
- Avoid landscape fabric and mulch.
- To the extent possible, delay garden cleanup until spring so insects and the soil gain nutrition and shelter.
- Avoid unnecessary mowing and pruning at times when blossoms are present.
