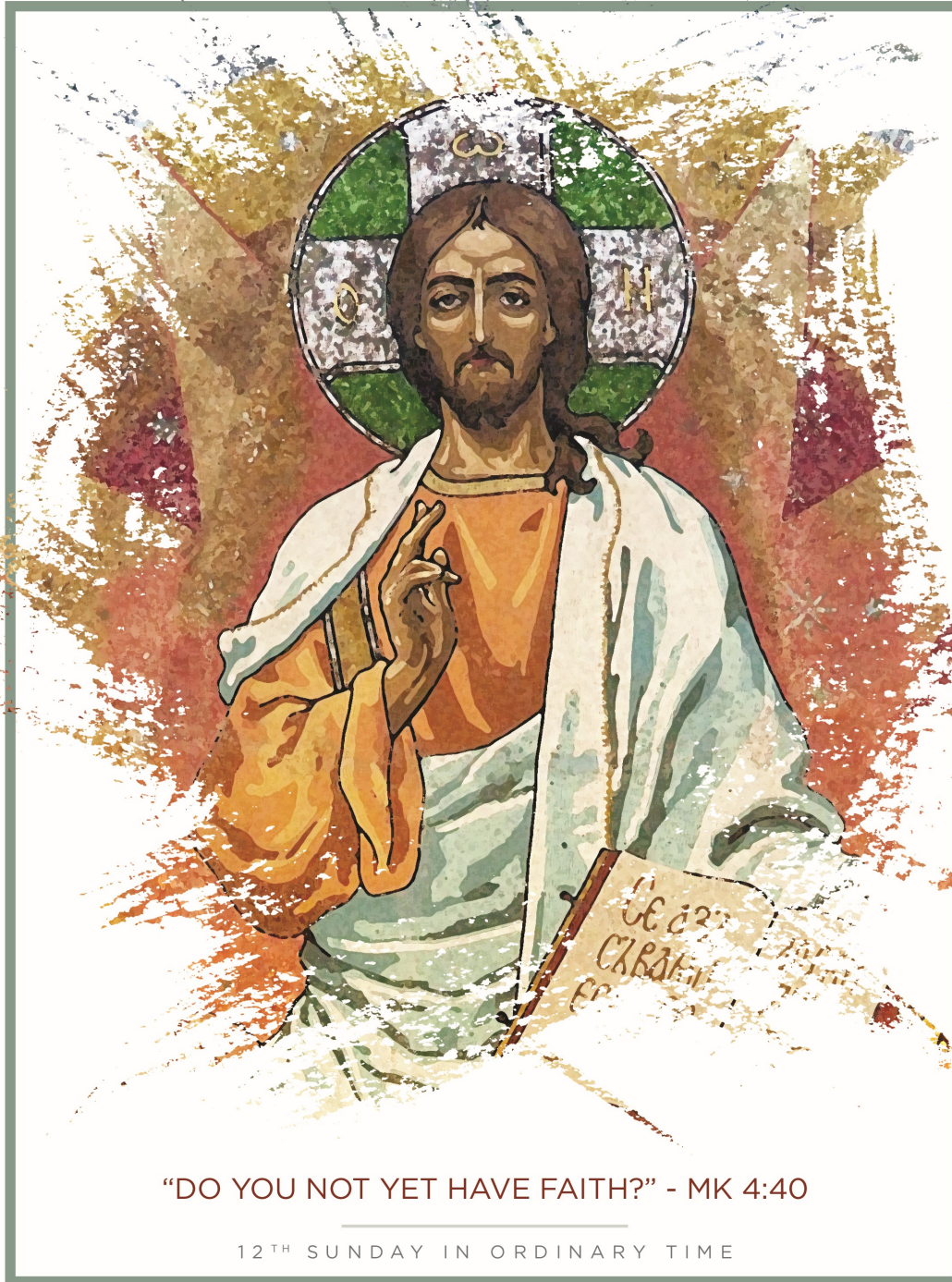

NO MASSES ON MONDAYS

St. Pius Tenth Parish will no longer offer Mass on Mondays. If you have scheduled a Mass for a loved one to be said on a Monday, it will be joined with the intentions at the rest of the weekday Masses.

Bishop Medley reinstated the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays & Holy Days effective June 12-13, 2021. Not bound by the sick, those with significant health risks as well as those who have fear or anxiety in a large gathering. Masks are not required, including the unvaccinated. The Sign of Peace is without physical contact for now. The Cup is not offered until further notice. Communion in the hand is strongly recommended & the safest. Communion on the tongue is permitted. The minister must use sanitizer before & after a person receives on the tongue.

Gift Bearers bringing up the bread & wine at weekend Masses will receive the Vocation Cross. Please pray for all vocations during the week & return the Cross the following weekend to the gift table in the back of church. Thank you!

New Curriculum. New Family Focused Sacrament Prep. New Monthly Community Days.

Pflaum Gospel Weeklies connect each lesson to the Gospel reading from that Sunday. With lessons updated every year, it brings the faith alive, connecting it to each child's lived experience of the faith. Since the lessons are based on the Gospel, parents and families can more easily connect with the lesson at home, continuing the conversation even after class is over.

Family Focused Sacrament Prep equips the family to live out the faith. The best method to prepare your child to receive the sacraments is to actively engage in them. This can sometimes feel like a daunting task, but coming together to support each other and strengthen our own faith will serve as a solid foundation on which to build up the faith for our children.

Monthly Community Days held once a month will serve as a time to build community. With no lessons on these Sundays, the entire parish is welcome to gather together to enjoy breakfast while fellowshiping with each other. Being a part of a community is also an important part of forming our faith. We are not called to live in our own bubble, but to spread the Good News to all we encounter!

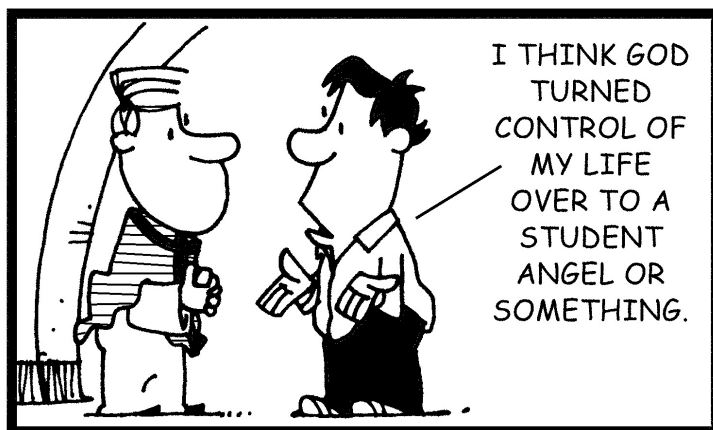
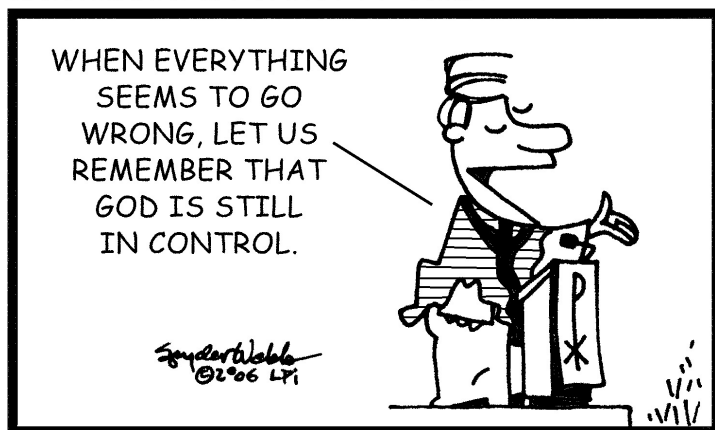

Question of the Week

Question:

What do the colors of the priest's and deacon's vestments mean?

Answer:

In the Roman Rite of the Catholic Church, the colors of the vestments evolved over the course of several centuries and there was wide variation both in the colors used, and in the feasts and seasons associated with particular colors. It was Pope Innocent III (d. 1216) who gave us the basic outline that was later prescribed by Pope Saint Pius V in 1570. The various colors remind us of the dominant themes of a particular season or celebration.

- White: Used for the seasons of Christmas and Easter and in celebrations of the Lord, of Mary, the angels, and saints who were not martyrs. This color is also used in Masses for the dead, at baptisms, weddings and other festive celebrations.
- Red: As the color of both blood and fire, red is used on Palm Sunday and Good Friday, as well as Pentecost and special celebrations of the Holy Spirit. Moreover, red is used on the feasts and memorials of the Apostles and those saints who died as martyrs.
- Violet: The color for Advent and Lent. Violet may also be used in Masses for the dead and on All Souls Day (November 2).
- Green: A color of life and hope, green is used throughout Ordinary Time.
- Other colors: Rose may be used on the Third Sunday of Advent and the Fourth Sunday of Lent, black may be used in Masses of the dead and on All Souls Day, gold or silver may be used on solemn occasions in place of white, red, or green. ©LPi
