Our 2020 quilt show chairs and committee chairs are working hard to contact vendors and advertisers and get things wound down while at the same time setting up for 2021.

As if that was not enough bad news, 39 of us were scheduled to board a bus for Dallas and the Dallas Quilt Show at the Market Hall on Friday morning. After checking their websites several times during the evening to make sure that the show was still going to happen, I went off to my church Life Group meeting. I had just gotten into bed around 10:30 when I got phone calls from Mary Lou Douglas and Karen Walters telling me that the Dallas show had just been cancelled. Someone from Dallas notified Karen. If that had not happened, we would have all been on our way to Dallas on Friday morning, unaware we had no show to go to. A big thank you to Karen for letting us know and to Mary Lou for helping me call everyone---at 11pm!! Also a big thank you to Pat Graham and Mary Lou Douglas for going to the church on Friday to intercept anyone who did not get the message and let them know what had happened.

In response to our country's efforts to curb the spread of the corona virus, we have cancelled our April 1st board meeting, April 2nd general meeting and April 3rd workshop with Nova Montgomery. At this time we are planning to have our May meeting and our June luncheon. We made enough money off of Raffle Tickets to still give our two charities very nice donations, so that will be done at the June luncheon. Plans are being made for our raffle quilt drawing as well as a fun activity at the June luncheon using the challenge blocks.

MINUTES OF MEETING**

First Christian Church March 12, 2020

The Quilters Guild of East Texas met at First Christian Church on Thursday, March 12, 2019. President Susan Merrill called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m.

Susan Merrill welcomed visitors and members to the Guild.

The February minutes were approved as distributed.

The financial report for February is posted in the lobby. If you have any questions, please contact Cecilia Brannon.

Special Presentation: Cathy Woodson presented Cecilia Brannon with a lifetime membership to the Guild for her many years of selfless service to the Quilt Guild of East Texas. Cecilia has served efficiently and effectively in many roles. In addition whenever a job needed doing and there was no one to do it, she stepped in. A framed certificate of service was also given to Cecilia.

NOTE: The April Board and Guild meeting has been moved up a week due to the Easter activities the second week of April. The Board will meet April 1, the Guild April 2 and the Featherweight workshop will be held Friday, April 3.

Susan Webber said The Hive will not meet today due to getting ready for the quilt show. In April they will begin a new project, a beautiful table runner. The Hive is a great way for new members to meet new friends and increase their quilting skills along with old members that want to hone their quilting technique.

Nancy Glass said Marjorie Jones of Love Spring Quilts will have a booth in the quilt show. She carries Hobbs batting and if anyone wants to go on her website and order some batting, she will bring it to the show which eliminates the cost of shipping. Nancy also thanked everyone for their wonderful response to the workshops. The workshop for April is Nova Montgomery, Featherweight machines. You must have a working featherweight and there is a two-page handout with important information for this workshop. In May Brenda Jeschke will conduct a day and half workshop for machine embroidery. She brought one of her beautiful completed quilt tops to show us a sample of what we will be doing. There is a supply list for this workshop as well. In June Martha Lindberg will bring a Christmas wall hanging and in July Cynthia Regone is conducting a workshop on mixed techniques.

Sue Bugg said the reports and ads for the April newsletter need to be into her by mid-week next week due to the April guild meeting a week earlier than usual. Also, all people wanting ads in the newsletter need to send their payment to Sue. The ads need to be paid for before Sue can publish them.

Marylou Douglas announced we have 185 members.

Special Events: The Dallas Bus trip is tomorrow, Friday, March 13. The bus will arrive in the First Christian parking lot next to Cotton Patch and the loop at 7:00 a.m. It will depart at 7:30 a.m. Hide-a-way people will be picked up at 8:00 a.m. The bus will depart Dallas at 3:30 p.m. Rose Wilson said the Greenbriar retreat is July 30 thru August 2. The cost is \$318.00 for three nights. There are three spots available for these dates. Also, Rose has secured another date at the Greenbriar August 27 thru Sunday, August 2. This would be a good time if some of the small bees would like to go to Greenbriar. Just let Rose know.

Sunshine and Shadows: - Susan Kellam said no sunshine today only shadows. She didn't have a deal but she did have a tip. You can use the serrated wheel in sewing for paper piecing.

Nancy Kemp presented the first block for Quilts of Valor for those who want to sign up to construct one of these veteran quilts. All you have to make is the top as she has long arm people ready to quilt them. Nancy shared the chaplain at Big Spring, who is a purple heart recipient, will receive our quilts of valor and distribute them to one of the VA Hospitals.

Karen Walters said Cuddle Quilts has several kits made and ready to be picked up and pieced. The tops need to be returned by the April Guild meeting and if you quilt and finish one, they need to be returned by the May meeting. These quilts will be distributed in June to Royal Family Kids Camp.

Karen then announced there are some Bees that have openings for new members. The list of bees is in the directory. If you are interested, you may contact Karen and she will get you lined up with a group.

Quilt Show chairmen Melanie Dossey said the show pins are ready. The banner has been hung at 2nd and Broadway in front of the Brannon office building. Yard signs can be placed in the yard the week of the quilt show. There will be a drawing for the one who sells the most raffle tickets for our beautiful 2020 quilt. The prize is a one-year free membership. Go to the QGET.org website and see the advertisement featuring Melanie that CBS is running now.

Karen Walters said more volunteers are needed in many areas. She also thanked Cody Leifer of Crow Towing for repairing the pole trailer and hauling our supply trailer to Harvey Hall free of charge. Quilts need to be brought to Harvey Hall on Tuesday morning, Aug. 24th between 8:30 and 11:30 a.m. Judging will begin immediately after the intake of the quilts. Set up for the show will begin on Tuesday. Thursday evening there will be a Preview night from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. for all guild members who are working the show and cannot always see the quilts. You may bring one guest and there are some wonderful door prizes. The show will open at 9:30 a.m. on Friday, March 27th and Saturday, March 28th. It will close both days at 4:30 p.m. Volunteer sign-in sheets will be located in the kitchen. Purse security will be near there as well. Sandwiches brought for the vendors need to be individually wrapped.

Susan Merrill gave a big thank you to Marilyn Hardy for finishing the 2021 quilt and Jackie Ruffing for quilting it. It will be on display at the 2020 Quilt Show.



BEST POTATO SOUP RECIPE

Ingredients

- 6 bacon strips, diced
- 3 cups cubed peeled potatoes
- 1 small carrot, grated
- 1/2 cup chopped onion
- 1 tablespoon dried parsley flakes
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper
- 1/2 teaspoon celery seed
- 1 can (14-1/2 ounces) chicken broth

- 3 tablespoons all-purpose flour
 - 3 cups 2% milk
 - 8 ounces process cheese (Velveeta), cubed
- 2 green onions, thinly sliced, optional**

Directions

1. In a large saucepan, cook bacon over medium heat until crisp, stirring occasionally; drain drippings. Add vegetables, seasonings and broth; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; simmer, covered, until potatoes are tender, 10-15 minutes.
2. Mix flour and milk until smooth; stir into soup. Bring to a boil, stirring constantly; cook and stir until thickened, about 2 minutes. Stir in cheese until melted. If desired, serve with green onions.

===== DESIGN: QUILT TOP & QUILTING =====

Design decisions are made for all aspects of a quilt top: style, color, theme, fabric placement, and many more. Then once completed, there are more design decisions to be made for the quilting to complete the overall design and enhance it. Two of these books (moving to the Art & Inspiration category) show the result of countless decisions to make unique quilts. The other book (in Guides & Techniques – Quilting) shows numerous quilting designs found in antique quilts and the various ways they can be used for traditional as well as contemporary quilts.

The Artist & The Quilt

Edited by Charlotte Robinson

This book tells about a 7-year experience (begun in 1975, designated by the United Nations as the “International Year of the Woman”) of a number of artists and quilters bringing the two together. It also tells the stories of numerous quilts and their quilt makers who stepped out of the tradition patterns of quilt making to create unique works. They experimented with many new methods and materials to produce artistic quilts.

Monkey Wrench: New Quilts from an Old Favorite

2004 contest sponsored by the Museum of American Quilter’s Society

Using a traditional, named quilt block as the starting point, this contest challenges quilters to interpret it in a work of their own design. This book features the quilt and quilters of the 5 award winners and 12 finalists. There are full-color photographs of the quilts as well as the comments of the winners as to their creative processes. The original Monkey Wrench pattern is included at the end of the book so that readers can begin their own creative adventure.

more ANTIQUE Quilting Designs

by Roberta Benvin

Six historical quilts were used as inspiration for the floral quilting patterns suitable for fusible applique, embroidery, fabric painting and stenciling as well as quilting. There are 85 quilting patterns that are a full page in size. There is a chart to aid in resizing them to fit the space on your quilt. The patterns are useful if reproducing an antique quilt but also can be used to enhance a modern day project.

QGET PROGRAMS AND WORKSHOPS

QGET is proud to be able to provide Tyler quilters with programs and workshops taught by many nationally renowned quilters. Our speakers are authors, quilt pattern designers, fabric dyers and nationally recognized instructors. Many have produced award winning quilts at some of the most prestigious quilt shows in the United States.

Programs are offered the second Thursday of each month following the QGET business meeting at First Christian Church, Tyler. There is no charge to attend a program. The business meeting begins at 10am and the Program generally starts around 11. Programs last 1-1.5 hours.

Workshops vary in length from 1/2 day to a full day. They are held on the second Friday of the month. Workshops are generally \$40 for members who sign up early and \$45 for members who sign up at the meeting the day before the workshop. Cost may vary with the length of the workshop. Workshops begin at 9am. Participants are encouraged to arrive by 8:30 to set up machines and supplies if necessary. Workshops are in the conference room at First Christian Church, Tyler. This room is located in the building behind the main sanctuary building. It is next to the scout room by the doors that lead out into the parking lot between the two buildings. Please note that these doors lock automatically and you may have to go around to the main entrance to this building to get in. When we have full day workshops, you are responsible for your lunch. You may bring a lunch or order from one of the restaurants close by.


