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## Pastor's Page

We cannot keep our kids from growing up. Eventually they will leave home to attend college and begin life on their own. Parents will no longer be able to make them go to church or insure that they will be spiritually engaged. What parents can do is instill a faith-based foundation that hopefully will lead them to make clear choices about their spiritual direction.

This is the purpose of Confirmation. Through the Body of Christ, young people can understand that spiritual choices are important in the path and decision they make. Confirmation is not a rite of passage nor a check-off on a "to do list." It is a teaching process which nurtures a child's awareness of God. It helps them prioritize a relationship through Christ. The underlying lesson of Confirmation is to help a young person make a relationship with God through Christ a priority in their life. Thus, participation in all aspects of Confirmation needs to be a priority. We will do everything possible to accommodate a family's busy lifestyle, which includes sports, vacation, school events, family activities and work. Still, we ask that the confirmands and their families make Confirmation a priority as well. A lifelong relationship with God demands a deep commitment and should be given the highest priority in a young person's life.

There are 5 components of the Confirmation process:

1. Class Lessons

2. Family involvement
3. Mentoring
4. Local Church activities
5. Outside activities

**IMPORTANT:** Class lessons are dependent on the other four components. If there is no active involvement in the other events, then class lessons will not be beneficial. It is up to the parents to ensure that each confirmand engages in all aspects of the process. These lessons are reliant on the confirmand's participation as well as the family's and mentor's involvement.

### Role of Family

Family Involvement encourages each household to set aside time to openly discuss the role of the church within the family structure. Each member from grandparents to youngest child should share in the growth and development of the confirmand's relationship with God, since that relationship is the foundation of the family's dynamics.

Parents should:

- Set expectations for your children about church participation, participation in Confirmation projects, activities and church attendance.
- Set an example by your own participation in the church.
- Stay in close communication with Pastor if there are any questions or concerns.
- Set aside specific time for active discussions of faith with all family members.

We do not want to disrupt the family's routine. It is important that parents use family time to explore their Christian values and help students incorporate those values into their lives. Confirmation is a family activity.

### **Mentoring**

Mentors will meet with the students to discuss questions they may have about their faith, provide a positive adult Christian role model, assist them with their service projects and lead them through developing their faith. The hope is that young people will develop a relationship with someone in the church who demonstrates that they genuinely care about them, their walk of faith and will assist the students in understanding what it means to live a life of faith. Mentors are not expected to have "all the answers." They are encouraged to dialogue with students rather than provide "correct responses" to the young person's questions. No question is too outlandish, and at this age young people may briefly explore seemingly outrageous beliefs. Allow this, ask questions, accept them where they are in their journey and share your own thoughts. Have fun!

#### **The Mentor is asked to do the following:**

- Have (3) three 30-45-minute conversations with their Confirmand within the 1-year period of Confirmation.
- The first conversation, dedicated to the Mentor and Confirmand getting to know each other, includes the Mentor sharing some part of his or her "faith story". The Mentor will talk about how they came to know God and what impact their Christian faith has on their life.
- The second conversation, held sometime in early fall, is dedicated to the Confirmand sharing what they have learned and how they have been challenged in their faith, positively and negatively.
- The third talk should involve a discussion on what is happening in the Confirmand's life and should be open to a free-flow sharing of thoughts and feelings. The confirmand should share how their perspective on faith has changed.
- Mentors should make themselves available should the Confirmand wish to speak with them confidentially.

**IMPORTANT:** These conversations are not meant to be lessons or evaluations. Their purpose is for each person to share their thoughts and get to know each other. You may share common interests which are not related to faith, but which help in creating a bond.

- Mentors are encouraged to attend with the confirmand other events or services outside their churches such as; another place of worship, spiritual rally or event. This is not required; however, it does provide an opportunity to visit and share with the Confirmand.
- Mentors will be allowed to attend class session; however, this is not required
- **IMPORTANT:** A Mentor cannot be a relative, Godparent or guardian. In some cases, two students can have the same mentor especially with siblings. This will need to be discussed with the Pastor and the mentor.

### **Local Church activities**

Active participation in church teaches valuable lesson and deepens their connection to the family of God. It allows them to experience each member's journey and define their own faith in the greater community of the church family. It can also instill a pattern of worship which maintains a healthy and connected relationship with God through the church, the Bride of Christ. While we hope they will remain faithful members of the Methodist church, Confirmation is intended to welcome them into God's universal church which the United Methodist is an active member of. There are many events they can attend and there will be some projects to complete. We do want them to participate in church services and will more clearly outline their responsibilities as we approach those events. The program also has suggestions for the parents and Mentors to engage with the kids. We encourage you to take an active role in their growth.

#### **Required Activities:**

- Methodist Confirmation Rally, TBD (usually in March) 2019 or 2020
- Confirmation Camp Comeca or Fontenelle in June or July of 2019 or 2020. TBD
- Gospel Celebration, July @ Webster Co Fair.
- Attend at least 12 regular Sunday services throughout the year
- In addition, assist with all special services including: Ash Wednesday, Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday. Good Friday, Easter, Christmas Eve
- Help with Communion
- Actively participate in a church sponsored youth group.

- Assist with at least one service at the Blue Hill Care Center.

### **Outside activities**

Events outside the local member's church help a young person experience how others live their faith. It can provide a perspective beyond the culture in which they have experienced church most of their lives. Seeing how others worship can broaden their awareness of God's presence in other communities and cultures. This can lead to a greater understanding of the role God has for His churches and for the confirmand. The following outside activities are encouraged;

- Invite friends to attend their church and attend their church as well.
- Attend Youth Rallies: Dare 2 Share (2019 or 2020), One Event (2019 or 2020)
- Attend Chrysalis or other spiritual growth events
- Visit other denominations/church/worship centers. Options include the following types though not all are required: Traditional, Contemporary, non-protestants (Catholic, Orthodox etc.), non-Christians (Jewish, Islamic, Buddhist).
- You may also consider Church of Latter Day Saints, Seventh Day Adventist, Friends/Quaker, Pentecostal and others. (Please take your parents and/or Mentor along. Also, please consult with me and your parents first before visiting a church which is not mainline or of a different culture.)

### **Itinerary and Age group**

The program contains lessons which will begin in February of each calendar year. We will meet the first and third week of each month with no classes in June, July and Aug. The kids will be busy with summer activities, so we will not try to maintain a class schedule. However, there are activities involving nursing home visits, the Gospel Celebration at the Webster Co. Fair and Confirmation camp that they will need to participate in. Also, we hope they will attend Church as often as summer schedules will allow. We will resume in Sept. and be finished by mid-February; essentially from the beginning of Lent, Ash Wednesday, till next year's Lent season. Tentatively, Confirmation is planned for either Palm or Easter Sunday.

Sundays are the preferred time for classes. Other nights or Saturday morning may also work. Within a month prior to the start of Confirmation, a meeting involving all participants; kids, parents and mentors will take place.

### **Age Groups**

To accommodate the unique demographics of our small member church we will be accepting children beginning at the age of 13. (Students who will turn 13 during the Confirmation year may be eligible. This will be determined by the Pastor and the parents.)

We understand that in a small member church Confirmation classes cannot occur every year and some groups need to be "bunched up" to avoid single student classes. My seminary instructor was surprised to learn that many of her student often conducted classes with as few as 1 student and rarely more than five. She had never experienced anything under 20.

Participation in programs such as Chrysalis and Dare 2 Share, though highly beneficial, can be challenging to some age groups. So, while we would like to make some events mandatory, such as Chrysalis,<sup>1</sup> they will be optional instead. We strive to create a lesson plan that accommodates a wide age range of students. This "uniqueness" in small member churches make the role of the mentor and the family essential in developing a strong foundation of faith especially for the younger group.

- Confirmation will begin in February of each calendar year and run till the following February of the following calendar.

#### **Summary**

- Requires a minimum of 2 participants
- Must be age 13 or older (with some exceptions)
- Classes will be the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month, unless otherwise determined.
- Each young person will choose a mentor who is not a family member or legal guardian. (Mentors can assist more than one student with approval from Pastor)
- Each child will actively participate in weekly service at least 12 times a year and in special services as outlined previously.

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<sup>1</sup> We strongly urge participants to attend when they reach the age of 15.

- They will attend Confirmation Camp, Bishop’s Confirmation Rally, Gospel Celebration.
- Participate in a church sponsored youth group.
- Confirmand’s family is asked to intentionally set aside time to engage in faith-based discussion with the confirmand.
- Obviously, we need to maintain some flexibility in the process. I encourage parents to visit with me, so we can discuss the specifics of your family’s situation. Our focus should always be on what is best for the kids. How can the congregation help parents raise kids with solid and permanent values based on the teaching of Christ Jesus? We pray that this Confirmation program will provide the building blocks for our children, for their families and for the communities in which they share and live their faith.

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


