How long does it take for the kids to get bored after school lets out? "Moooom, there's nothing to do!" Well, there are two quality places for them to go where they can also travel along the road of their faith journey. Lake Chautauqua Lutheran Center and Vandercamp are ministries of our Upstate New York Synod, and they are right in our backyard (for the Southwest and Crossroads Conferences, literally so!). Parents can be secure in knowing their kids are being supervised by responsible counsellors, having fun, and making new friends. In a lot of congregations, teens don't have many friends their own age, peers they can share stuff with. At camp, there will be dozens! Lifelong friendships sometimes happen. For kids who might find traditional church irrelevant, camp is a place to worship under the stars by a fire, to be themselves without any judgment, to find community, to be able to discover their gifts. Pastor's message..

A prayer for the road – every road.

Psalm 143:9-12 The Message

If you wake me each morning with the sound of your loving voice,
I'll go to sleep each night trusting in you. Point out the road I must travel;

I'm all ears, all eyes before you.
Save me from my enemies, God—
you're my only hope!
Teach me how to live to please you,
because you're my God.
Lead me by your blessed Spirit
into cleared and level pastureland.
Keep up your reputation, God—give me life!

The Psalms are a place in scripture where the reader can find plenty of space of prayer that encompass all the emotions of human experience.

Psalm 51 - a prayer of contrition.

Psalm 62 – a prayer of longing for God's presence.

Psalm 67 – a prayer for blessing.

Psalm 118 – praises the goodness of God.

In the Psalms we find loss, joy, anger, frustration, defeat, excitement and everything in-between. This sacred text offers space to engage our full selves; fitted with the generations of people that have read it in the past. We can bring all our emotions and experiences to the Psalms and find a safe space of prayer and conversation with God.

Psalm 143 is a song of pleading with God, for help, for release from potential imprisonment (literal or figurative), for a return of

verve, for freedom from attack and hopelessness. If ever there is a Psalm that speaks to the low places of life, 143 fits the bill. However, while the psalmist of this particular psalm does not have immediate repair of their difficulty; they do remember God's goodness. The writer's history and story of God's presence in the past is a thread of hope for their present and future and says this to God..." Show me the road I must travel for you, God, to relieve my heart."

Over the last month in worship, we have started to share our God stories with one another. Sharing spiritual autobiographies in story is a practice of connecting or re-connect us with our remembrances of God, much like the writer of Psalm 143.

When we share our "God stories", we remember, we hope and we encourage one another in our faith. When sharing our God stories, we keep things real, we are authentic about who we are, who God is and how God is with us in all circumstances of life.

For every road we travel – God is with us.

For every situation we are in – God is present. For every emotion we feel – God is just waiting for us to share what is on our heart, mind and soul. Prayer is the safe space where we can say, "God, show me the road I must travel for you – relieve my heart."

was guiding a rope through a pulley that was attached to a horse at one end and a hay bale at the other. The horse bolted and his left thumb entered the pulley badly disfiguring it. His plans to study for the priesthood were dashed as at that time one had to have perfect hands to touch the Eucharist. Not so today. My father continued his college studies, but turned his attention to a young woman living next door to his rooming house on Seneca Street in Buffalo. They dated and in 1935 were married, moved to Lakewood and from 1938 to 1948 added the five of us to their family. We all owe our lives to that horse!

When I was 13 I attended a church camp in Angola on Lake Erie. We were all swimming and were warned about the undertow by the lifeguard. A younger boy was ahead of me and as a wave came over him we were both drawn into deeper water by the undertow. He was in over his head. It wasn't very dramatic or noticed by the lifeguard, but I reached for him, pulled him to me in a bear hug and carried him to shallower water. I don't think either one of us said a word, but he looked very relieved. I never thought much about it, but in some way I had re-payed Harold by saving this boy from drowning. If my father had become a priest I wouldn't have been near the boy to save him. Thanks again to the horse. I wonder whatever became of him? Wouldn't it be something if he became the priest or minister that my father couldn't be? Only God knows!

The foreboding God of my youth has been replaced by a much kinder one that, as can be seen in my life story, has a benevolent sense of humor.

When God Came Near

I was eight and it was a warm early June afternoon. My friend Harold and I decided to throw paper plates at he Lakewood Beach Park by taking turns throwing them from the Rescue Boat House dock and retrieving them from the shore. It was my turn to collect as I watched Harold on the dock. He waved to me as I collected, but he had turned his back to the water and stood on tip-toe at the very edge, with 12 feet of water below. The next time I looked he had disappeared. I feared the worst and ran to the boat house, dropping to my knees half way there, asking God to save him. I swear both knees hit the ground but I didn't miss a step as I raced to the end of the dock. All I could see was the top of Harold's head disappear in the depths. I called to some friends to tell the fire department and raced home. I was told I was late for dinner, but had to explain that Harold was drowning. My parent's weren't sure what to believe until the very loud fire siren went off and my father jumped up and ran to the fire hall.

The adults were concerned that I would be traumatized by Harold's death, but I knew that if I had tried to save him there would have been two boys that drowned. I was told that God took Harold to heaven because he was so good. I knew what kind of mischief we both got into and if he was that good, I was likely to be next to go! Shortly after his funeral, Harold's mother gave me his prized silver dollar which I still have after nearly 70 years. I drilled a hole in it to make sure I never spent it.

When my father was helping put in hay on the family farm he

Create this colorful July 4th craft.

What you need:

- Decorated card stock square (5"x 5")
- Scissors
- Hole punch
- 2 one-inch circles of card stock
- Glue
- Pipe cleaner (3 inches)
- Drinking straw

What you do:

- Fold the square corner to corner to form an X. Unfold.
- 2. To make spokes, cut the four creases until an inch from the center.
- 3. Punch a hole in the middle of the square, near the tips of each spoke, and in the middle of each circle.
- 4. Fold each spoke toward the center, lining up the holes. Glue in place.
- 5. Wrap one end of the pipe cleaner around the top of the straw. Thread a circle, the pinwheel, and the remaining circle onto the pipe cleaner.
- 6. Roll the pipe cleaner end into a ball. Then spin!


