Hope to see you all there; it will be a great time.



On behalf of the Board and staff of the West Seattle Food Bank we would like to thank you for your generous donation of \$500 plus 125 pounds of food. This holiday season more families than ever before are depending on our services. This last year has seen many changes at the West Seattle Food Bank. In February of 2017 we adopted a "shopping style" distribution and significantly expanded the number of hours we are open for distribution each week.
