

Spiritual Gifts and Passions Inventory

What we learned with your help...

This Fall, everyone was invited and encouraged to complete a Spiritual Gifts and Passions Inventory. This inventory was designed to help you better understand how God has gifted you to serve, and the unique concerns God has laid on your heart about the needs around us. I appreciate the 31 people who completed the inventory and shared their results with us. We promised to give you an overview of the responses we received, so here's what we found!



This shows how many times a particular spiritual gift showed up prominently in people's responses. It's not unusual for people to have more than one gift for serving, just as we all have a number of abilities.

Notice we had a lot of people with the caring heart of a "shepherd" and great organizational skills. That's exciting! In order for us to do the work God has given us to accomplish, those organizers help us to be more effective, and the care-givers help us to meet needs along the way.

What was most rare was the gift of Trailblazer / Apostle. And that's not surprising. Those people who can envision something new, create a ministry where there is currently nothing, form a team to get it done... They are a special breed! And we need them, but we only need a few. Because the rest of us, with our other gifts, are needed to carry out the ministries they create!

Regarding the "Passions" section of the inventory, there were people concerned about every area of need we listed. We had people for whom God had given them a special concern for children, or senior adults. Others were focused on those in poverty, young adults, those who were dealing with illness or disabilities. We had numerous people concerned about issues like addiction, injustice, debt, and hunger. A large group shared that they wanted to be involved in caring for the needs of other Christians, which matches the large "shepherd" group above. And so many of you listed your concern for those who don't know our Savior.

We will be referring back to this information all through the year as we start new ministries, grow existing ministries, and touch the lives of people in Christ's love. A special thanks to all who got us started on identifying how God's Spirit is at work equipping the people of First Baptist Church to do His Kingdom work.
