Vacation Bible School, or VBS, is a fun-filled program usually offered during the summer ("vacation") months, to connect with children and their families. VBS is an outreach meant to bring in children who don't normally attend church and to teach them the gospel. As an evangelistic tool, VBS helps churches to fulfill the <u>Great Commission</u> (Matthew 28:19).

"Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit."

Coming in the Fall:

⇒ Rally Day - September 15th: First day of classes for all ages for the new year.

This is the celebration of the start to the new church year (liturgical) with a renewed effort in involving children, youth, and adults in Sunday morning classes for Christian education.

⇒ Confirmation Class: These classes will be incorporated into the regularly scheduled classes

Confirmation class is preparation during which the candidates participate in church activities and reflect on questions of faith and life. This is an opportunity to pause on the verge of adulthood and examine our beliefs and explore how faith might be a good life-long partner.

If you were baptized as children or infants, it is our parents who initially accept the vows on our behalf. Confirmation then becomes our opportunity to personally reaffirm those baptismal vows and claim the grace offered by Christ in baptism. Confirmation is a reaffirmation of our baptismal vows.

PENTECOST

May 19, 2024

Pentecost is a Christian holiday which takes place on the 50th day after Easter Sunday and the 10th day after Jesus' ascension. It commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon Mary, mother of Jesus and the Apostles of Jesus while they were in Jerusalem cele-

brating the Feast of Weeks, as described in the Acts of the Apostles.

WHY DO CHRISTIANS CELEBRATE PENTECOST?

The description in Act 2 states that, after Jesus ascended into heaven, Jesus' followers were gathered together for the Feast of Harvest (aka Pentecost), and the Holy Spirit "filled the whole house where they were sitting" (Acts 2:2). "All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them" (Acts 2:4). This unusual event drew a large crowd, and Peter stood up to speak to them about repentance and the gospel of Christ (Acts 2:14). By the end of the day that the Holy Spirit came, the Church grew by 3,000 people (Acts 2:41). This is why Christians still celebrate Pentecost.

John Gill expresses the significance in his commentary: "Through this baptism of the Holy Ghost and fire, the apostles became more knowing, and had a greater understanding of the mysteries of the Gospel, and were more qualified to preach it to people of all nations and languages."

A PRAYER FOR PENTECOST

Dear Heavenly Father, on this day, 2000 years ago, you inaugurated the church by having the Holy Spirit indwell in your believers. We rejoice that you have allowed us, men and women, Jew and Gentile, to experience new life. Thank you for the gift of the Holy Spirit, our comforter, our guide, and so many other things. And may we continue to celebrate this day until you return again. Amen.

Ascension of the Lord - May 9th, 2024

Forty days after the Resurrection of the Lord (Easter Sunday), we remember and celebrate the Ascension of the Lord Jesus Christ into heaven. On this day, the church gives thanks for Christ's sovereign rule over all the earth, as well as his priestly intercession for us at the throne of mercy). (See Luke 24:50-53 and Acts 1:1-11; see also Mark 16:19-20.)

Almighty God, whose blessed Son our Savior Jesus Christ ascended far above all heavens, that he might fill all things: Mercifully give us faith to perceive that according to his promise he abideth with his Church on earth, even unto the end of the world; through the same thy Son Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Ascension of the Lord is an important event for believers.



A short history:

In the Gospel it is written that the Son of God was resurrected and at that time was among his flock. He gathered all the apostles on the Mount of Olives, where he blessed his disciples and ascended to heaven. It was then that angels appeared and announced that Jesus Christ would return to earth to his disciples.

What does the feast of the Ascension of Christ mean, four main points:

- 1. The ascension of Christ is His spiritual presence everywhere, without which there would be no gift of the Holy Spirit;
- 2. Christ ascended to heaven to "prepare a place for his followers", for those who "in Christ" hope to be with their Master one day;
- 3. The ascension of the Son of God proves that the sacrifice was not in vain and was accepted by God;
- 4. Ascension means that there is a person in heaven who sympathizes with all living things on Earth and is also able to be his deputy.

Christ is an example for mankind. He went through all the stages of life's experience—birth, growing up, earthly temptations, suffering, and death.

Commonly-Asked Questions

Is the Ascension the same as Pentecost?

The Ascension and <u>Pentecost</u> are <u>not the same</u>, though they are connected. It was 10 days after Jesus' Ascension into Heaven that the <u>Holy Spirit</u> was able to descend upon His disciples. Pentecost signals the end of the Easter season and is also the day we recognize as the birth of the Church.

What happened between the Ascension and Pentecost?

For ten days, Jesus' disciples and Mary patiently and prayerfully waited for the coming of the Holy Spirit.

Christ is Lord

An excerpt from the Companion to the Book of Common Worship (Geneva Press, 2003, 108-109)

In that John Calvin's theology placed great importance on the ascended and regnant Christ, Ascension Day is in some ways *the* Presbyterian feast day. Christ is Lord of the world and head of the church, we proclaim. Christ's ascension, therefore, concerns us not only with ecclesiastical matters but also with social and political ones. If Christ has ascended, then there are no other rulers — all others are merely pretenders. Christ reigns supreme.

With the raising of Christ to a position above all worldly powers, the earthly ministry of Christ begun at Christmas's incarnation now concludes. The path of faithfulness obediently followed by Christ traveled through the suffering of the cross to the exaltation of the glory. From glory to suffering to glory again is the shape of Jesus' ministry as well as ours. We too, are destined for the glory we share now in Christ only by faith. "It does not yet appear what we shall be, but we know that when Christ appears we shall be like him" (1 John 3:2).

MEMORIAL DAY

May 27, 2024

Memorial Day is a federal holiday in the United States for honoring and mourning the U.S. military personnel who died while serving in the United States Armed Forces.

Memorial Day was borne out of the Civil War (which ended in 1865) and a desire to honor our dead. New York was the first state to officially recognize the holiday in 1873. It was recognized by all northern states by 1890. Differently, the South refused to acknowledge the day and honored their dead on separate days. This went on until after World War I when the holiday changed from honoring just those who died fighting in the Civil War

to honoring Americans who died fighting in any war.

History and the Meaning of Memorial Day: Red Poppies

In 1915, inspired by the poem "In Flanders Fields," Moina Michael replied with her own poem:



We cherish too, the Poppy red that grows on fields where valor led, It seems to signal to the skies that blood of heroes never dies.

She then conceived of an idea to wear red poppies on Memorial day in honor of those who died serving the nation during war. She was the first to wear one, and sold poppies to her friends and co-workers with the money going to benefit servicemen in need. See more on the significance of the Red Poppy.



CHILDREN'S CORNER

Parents, please read this to your younger child(ren)

Pentecost

Theme: The Holy Spirit came on the day of Pentecost.

Object: A windsock; a strong fan

Scripture: Acts 2:1-21

You probably know this is a windsock or a type of kite. It was invented many years ago in Japan and was flown on "Boys Day." Families would hang one windsock for each son in their family. You might've seen one at an airport, too. They show pilots which way the wind is blowing so they can take off and land safely. They're even used to help guide the Space Shuttle pilots.




No one can see the wind, but we know the wind is there because it moves the windsock. But just because we can't see the wind, that doesn't mean it's not important. The wind helps us cool off when we get hot; it cleans the air from smog; and it can even be used to power our homes. What other things can you think of that the wind does? (Pause.)

God's Spirit is kind of like the wind. We can't see the Holy Spirit, but the Holy Spirit is very important and always with us. What is something else you can think of that you can't see but is still very important? (Pause.)

When God sent His Holy Spirit to be with His people for the first time, it was like a mighty, rushing wind. (Lead kids in making a "whoosh!" sound.) Many churches still celebrate that special day. It's called the day of Pentecost. A bunch of believers were all gathered together. (Turn on the fan, and blow it on the children.) When the loud wind came, they saw what looked like tongues of fire that came to rest on each of them, and all of them were filled with the Holy Spirit. How would you feel if you saw fire coming down on your head? Would you be scared? (Pause.)

The Holy Spirit helped them share God's message of love with everyone around by speaking other languages! When we believe, God puts His Holy Spirit in us, too. (While still feeling the wind from the fan, invite children to say "I believe!" and say an affirmation over each child, such as "God's Holy Spirit lives in you!")

There are so many ways the Holy Spirit helps us every day. You might say, "He is the wind in your socks!"








The Day of Pentecost




