Successful Initiatives - Shared Services

Goodfellow AFB: Improved child care options for servicemen and the community – (MOU)

Summary: MOU states Goodfellow AFB will increase the amount of childcare for military members stationed at the base by selecting and training providers from licensed care homes within the San Angelo area through cooperation with the Concho Valley Workforce Department.

Stakeholders: Installation and Community

Installation:

- More efficient use of classroom resources for both base and community staff
- More efficient use of classroom resources and opportunities for knowledge sharing with civilian counterparts

Community:

- Increased knowledge sharing
- One new licensed provider and three more are completing the training



Successful Initiatives - EUL

Ellsworth AFB: Research Partnership Uses for Underutilized Buildings and Property: Advance Health Lease for Building 4040 – Lease

Summary: The lease agrees that the AF will lease office space in a portion of building 4040 to Drynachan, LLC- Advance Health at Ellsworth in return for monthly payments. Lessee shall have general use of the public lobbies, entrances, stairs, corridors, elevators, restrooms, all drives, parking areas, parking lots, and other public portions of the building.

Stakeholders: Ellsworth AFB, Advance Health (Drynachan, LLC) **Installation**:

Leased use of underutilized facilities with a lease income equal to \$635K (FY15-FY20)

Community:

Grants access to installation facilities



Successful Initiatives - Energy

Maxwell AFB: Transfer of diesel fuel to Alabama Army National Guard – Verbal Agreement

Support: Agreement is between Alabama Army National Guard (ALARNG), the Defense Information Systems Agency (DISA), and Maxwell AFB for the transfer of diesel fuel. Approximately 15K gallons of fuel was transferred from DISA generators located on Maxwell AFB-Gunter Annex to the Alabama Army National Guard at no cost. ALARNG fuel trucks transferred the fuel to various units around the state. The fuel was made available as DISA is completing a modernization project and installing new generators for their building.

Stakeholders: Alabama Army National Guard, Maxwell AFB-Gunter Annex, Defense Information Systems Agency

Installation:

- > \$37,500 DoD cost savings
- > Environmentally friendly transfer of fuel
- Improved cooperation and engagement between Maxwell
- AFB and ALARNG



Successful Initiatives - Training

Laughlin AFB: Grow your own skilled education, training, certification programs in aircraft maintenance – MOU

Summary: MOU between the 47th Flying Training Wing Maintenance Group (47 FTW), the Southwest Texas Junior College (SWTJC) and San Felipe Del Rio School District provides high school students the opportunity to earn an aircraft maintenance certification via SWTJC's offerings in order to support the 47 FTW through workforce development

Stakeholders: Installation, SWTJC, Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, local educational institutions and universities

Installation:

- Enable the base to fill up to 81 vacancies in critical mission areas
- Increase output of student pilots and number of flying hours, enable greater efficiencies
- 40 students began Summer 2015 classes with the expectation of Spring 2016 graduation
- 80 prospective students are on the waiting list for college or high school courses

Community:

Creation of two teaching positions (salaries \$75K each)



Discussion – Round 2 Ideas

Each idea must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Initiative must fill a base requirement or organizational need, generate financial savings, gain greater efficiencies, improve and/or expand current services, etc.
- 2. Must have a champion to actively engage stakeholders to continue momentum throughout the implementation process
- 3. Must have the support of all essential stakeholders
