

AMELIA VILLAGE, OHIO  
Ordinance O-2019-20

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING  
BIDDING THRESHOLD FOR CONTRACTS  
AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, Amelia Village Charter Sec. 5.01(D)(2) provides that Council shall establish a threshold amount, notice provisions and other procedures for competitive bidding for contracts for the construction of a public improvement or for the purchase of equipment, supplies, or materials; and

WHEREAS, Amelia Village Council finds that the threshold amounts, notice provisions and other procedures for contracts pursuant to Amelia Village Charter Sec. 5.01(D)(2) are adequately provided for within the statutory requirements of the Revised Code;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of Amelia Village, Clermont County, Ohio, that;

SECTION I. Council hereby finds that the threshold amount, notice provisions and other procedures for competitive bidding for contracts for the construction of a public improvement or for the purchase of equipment, supplies, or materials shall follow the statutory requirements of the Revised Code.

SECTION II. Council hereby finds and determines that all formal actions relative to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of its committees, if any, which resulted in formal action, were taken in meetings open to the public, in full compliance with applicable legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION III. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and general welfare of the Village. The reason for such necessity is to immediately clarify the Village's intent to comply with statutory bidding provisions pursuant to the Village Charter. Therefore, provided this emergency clause receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, this ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

MR. FISCHER moved to suspend the rules requiring two readings on two separate dates.


