Dear Parishioners:

Last July I recall looking at the new pastoral assignments for the summer of 2019 and I noticed that many men who were ordained the years prior to me were already becoming pastors. I had a hunch that I was on deck for a pastoral assignment for July of 2020. With this in mind I spent all of last year preparing myself for the duty of pastor. As I was on-deck to be a pastor last year I started thinking about how I would lead a parish. I carefully reflected closely on how the pastors who trained me in seminary and in my priesthood lead their parishes as good shepherds. Each pastor had some sort of goal in mind to guide them in pastoring the flock. So before I arrived here for my pastoral assignment I pondered on what my first year goal would be for the people of Crestline and Bethlehem. Whatever this goal was I knew that it had to come from prayer and that it had to help me formulate important parish decisions.

I believe that if one wants to be faithful to a mission they need at least one goal placed before them to keep them on track. As a secular example ...a tall and strong basketball player who might not be a good shooter or dribbler might have a goal such as "I'm going to try to get 10 rebounds a game every game this season." The goal is achievable and simple. And anything that gets in the way of this goal is to be shunned. Let's say this basketball player has a male and female trainer. The female trainer asks the basketball player to lift weights 3 times a week. The player would likely commit to this weight training regimen for a strong build and quick leaping ability is helpful in getting rebounds. But let's say other trainer, the male trainer asked the basketball player to practice shooting half court shots 2 hours each day. The player would be wise to absolutely deny this request, because it will not help him reach his goal of being a better rebounder. In fact the basketball player would question the competency of his male trainer and would likely think twice about any advice that trainer would suggest in the future.

Like the pastors before me and like the made up basketball player in this story I too have a yearly goal for my first year as pastor and it is this, "With God's help our parishes are going to increase in the wisdom and charity of Christ." The goal is simple and achievable. We need not be perfect in God's wisdom and charity... we simply need to all grow in it over the course of this year. This goal will be a litmus test for any question sent my way for this year, because I expect our activities to promote wisdom and charity. Let's say someone gives me an idea that has nothing to do with growing in God's wisdom and charity...does this mean I will totally neglect the suggestion? No rather I will take the good from the suggestion and see if it can fit the goal with a little refinement. In my first week as pastor I have had many great suggestions sent my way and as I have pondered these suggestions I notice that some fit very well into my goal of wisdom and charity and others need to be flushed out a little before planning can occur. Regardless if they fit the mold of my goal or not...I want you to know that I appreciate all the suggestions sent my way because they are all delivered with a loving heart and desire to help our parishes grow in holiness together. Together with God's help may we grow in the wisdom and charity of Christ!
