Dear Parishioners,

The Holy Spirit works in mysterious ways. Last week we celebrated Pentecost. Pentecost marks the descent of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles, they were granted the gifts of the Holy Spirit. Those gifts helped them to fulfill their mission to preach the Gospel to all nations. For us, those gifts were granted when we are infused with sanctifying grace, the life of God in our souls. This helps us to live as a Catholic Christian in our daily life. To live as a faith filled Catholic Christian, we need to rely on the gifts of the Holy Spirit throughout our daily lives. The gifts of the Holy Spirit are wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety and fear of the Lord. Each one of these gifts is precious by themselves. However, God intended the gifts to work together to live as Catholic Christians.

The gifts of the Holy Spirit are:

Wisdom- Through wisdom, we come to value properly those things which we believe through faith. The truths of Christian belief are more important than the things of this world.

Understanding- Once we become convinced through understanding of the truths of our faith, we can also draw conclusions from those truths and arrive at a further understanding of man's relation to God and his role in the world.

Counsel- Counsel allows us to judge rightly what we should do in a particular circumstance. It goes beyond prudence, though, in allowing such judgments to be made promptly, the Catholic Encyclopedia notes, counsel "enables us to see and choose correctly what will help most to the glory of God and our own salvation".

Fortitude- Fortitude is the virtue that allows us to overcome fear and to remain steady in our will in the face of all obstacles, physical and spiritual.

Knowledge- Knowledge allows us to see the circumstances of our life the way that God sees them. Through this gift of the Holy Spirit, we can determine God's purpose for our lives and live them accordingly.

Piety - Piety, like each of the gifts of the Holy Spirit, helps us to live our lives as full and complete human beings. Piety draws us to Mass; it prompts us to pray, even when we may not feel like doing so. Piety calls us to respect that natural order created by God, including the natural human order; to honor our father and our mother, but also to respect all of our elders and those in authority.

Fear of the Lord- This gift of the Holy Spirit gives us the desire not to offend God, as well as the certainty that God will supply us the grace that we need in order to keep from offending Him.

As a sinner, I call upon the gifts of the Holy Spirit daily. Some of the gifts, for me, are easier to understand/achieve while others are cloudy for me to infuse in my daily life. However with the grace of the Holy Spirit each day I strive to be a better Catholic Christian. Most likely I'm in good company asking for the Holy Spirit for a better understanding of the fruits of the Holy Spirit. These gifts have helped our brothers and sisters in Christ throughout their lives. When the gifts of the Holy Spirit work together in our lives we are living the Gospel as the Apostles did.
