

Spring Break Mission Team Serves in Oklahoma

First Baptist sent a team of 10 people to Oklahoma over spring break. I was fortunate to be part of the group that worked at Murrow Indian Children's Home in Muskogee, Oklahoma. Murrow is an American Baptist ministry that has been in operation for over 100 years. It serves Native American children who are in state or tribal custody, with around 20-30 children living at Murrow at any given time.

The campus includes four cottages. Our group stayed in one of the cottages and spent most of the time making repairs and improvements on this cottage, which will be used for a transitional program where those who are aging out of the system of foster care/state and tribal custody will live more independently and learn skills needed as they prepare to move out on their own. We painted, hung doors, installed baseboard, did some plumbing repairs, cleaned, organized, and created artwork for the cottage. We also raked leaves and did yardwork on the campus.

Murrow is adjacent to the campus of Bacone College, an American Baptist-affiliated school that has historically served Native American students. Our group had the opportunity to worship on Sunday morning at Bacone Baptist Church, which meets in the college chapel. We also had the chance to visit the Museum of the Five Civilized Tribes and learn about Native American history, the Trail of Tears, and Native American culture.

All in all, it was a wonderful week. We enjoyed cooking and sharing meals together, playing games and hanging out together, and working together. We came up with a list of 25 projects large and small that we completed, and all of the team members, from age 7 to, well, a lot more than that, contributed to the work and led one of our devotion times. We accomplished a lot, learned a lot, and gained from the experience. We had a chance to reflect spiritually on themes including service, humility, justice, compassion, and seeing Christ in others.

Congratulations to ISU Award Winners!



Congratulation to two FBC members who were honored recently by Iowa State University for their efforts in outreach.

Barbara Woods was honored with the ISU Award for Distinguished

Service in Extension. According to ISU Extension and Outreach, this is the highest award bestowed on an Extension professional, recognizing "sustained distinguished performance and educational contributions to Iowa State's clientele through extension programs."

A press release noted, "Barbara Woods is a valued leader in Extension statewide and nationally. In her 30-year career at Iowa State, she has led the implementation of technology to support management and program delivery, provided financial management programming for urban families, and, most recently, coordinated state and national programming for at-risk families and youth. She is active in three national Extension associations, and she is widely respected for her volunteer service and leadership with such organizations as Habitat for Humanity, United Way and several community organizations."

Elizabeth Stegemöller was recognized by the College of Human Sciences with the Early Achievement in Outreach award. The award is given to faculty in their first five years of service who have made outstanding contributions in outreach to the community. Part of Elizabeth's research on Parkinson's disease includes the singing and music and movement groups for Parkinson's Disease patients that meet here at our church. Sessions of the singing group are now being videotaped and will be used to facilitate virtual singing groups in other parts of the state.

"Spirited Listening" Coming in June!

Our church is a member of AMOS (A Mid-Iowa Organizing Strategy) - a grassroots, congregationally-based community organizing group. AMOS researches issues that are of concern to the community and works to make changes that benefit and make for a more fair, just, and workable community for everybody.

The way that AMOS determines which issues to address is through "House Meetings" of 6-8 people in which persons share what concerns and pressures they feel in their lives – what "keeps them awake at night." Out of the stories shared in a multitude of meetings held by many congregations and institutions, themes emerge, and common themes lead to issues for research and action.

These small group conversations can be a great opportunity for our church to not only get involved in our local community but to also learn more about our friends and neighbors. On **Pentecost Sunday, June 4** - when we celebrate God's gift of the Holy Spirit - we will be involved in "Spirited Listening" as we listen to one another's stories, and listen to the Spirit leading us.

The way it will work: at the conclusion of that morning's worship service, those who are willing to participate will break into small groups in which we will share some of our stories. Each group will have a trained leader to guide the conversation, keep us on track, and help us be mindful of time. Participants will only be asked to share what they are comfortable sharing. The exercise will take no longer than an hour, and we will then join together for a meal. Emerging themes from our conversations will help determine the issues for AMOS research teams to address, but perhaps more important than that will be the value to our congregation as we listen to each other's stories.
