VERY IMPORTANT POLICY CHANGE

Due to rising costs in the industry, SAABE will be implementing a new policy. There has been a recurring theme of Regular members RSVPing to the luncheons and then not attending. When you RSVP, we have provide a headcount to the venue and when you don't show, SAABE still has to pay for your plate. On average, we spend \$300 or more on lunches each month for members that were not present. Due to this, beginning in January 2018, we will begin charging our Regular members for recurring noshows to the luncheons. If you RSVP and don't attend, you will get one free pass per year and if you miss a second time, you will be charged \$20.00, the cost of your lunch. We hate to put this policy in place and have avoided it for many years, but this is a cost that SAABE can't continue to absorb and our options are to drastically raise annual dues, or implement a policy that charges per occurrence. 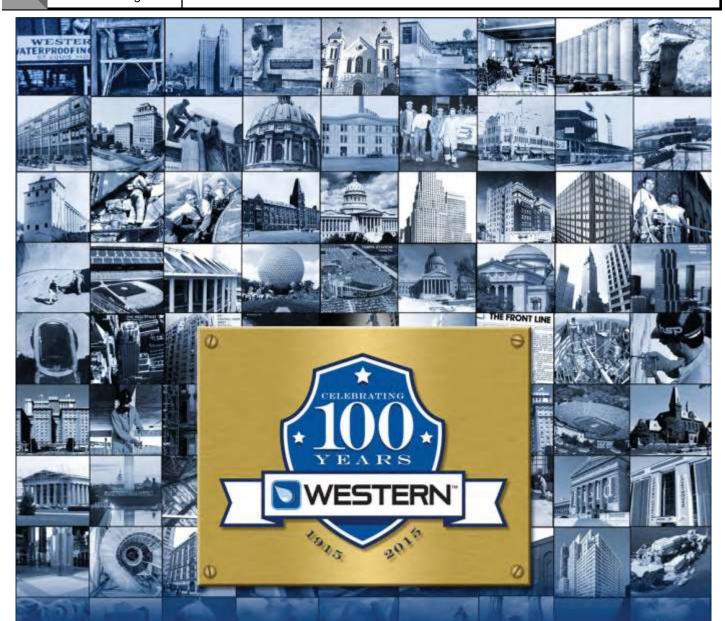
