On May 3rd the GSPC of Indiana was very well represented at the Becoming an Outdoor Woman (BOW) camp held in Lafayette. Club members Tim & Bub Conley, Dave & Tyler Tharp, Steve Hammond, Brad Wise, Ross & Lauren Newhouse, and Matt, Vicki & Hunter Sanders all brought their dogs to help with this event. I want to first and foremost thank them for their time and experience that helped make this a smooth and exciting event.

We had a very short classroom training session and then we went right to the bird field. After an intro and safety talk, I used the Alan Montgomery patented "pass it off to Conley technique" and Tim showed some beginning training work with the Newhouse's 13 wk old pup Blaze. We then had two dogs in the field with their handlers while two shooters were escorted by two

other club members to make sure this was a safe event. There were 12 women with degrees of experience varying from none to "seasoned" hunters. Two of the women shot their first bird ever and one kept it to be mounted by a taxidermist. Every time a bird fell, there were shouts of praise from the gallery. All of the women were impressed with the dog work which was represented by three generations of the Montgomerycreek bloodlines. We had master, senior and junior hunters that all showed their stuff. One participant just wanted to walk and watch the dogs. After our time in the field we went to lunch with the participants and they had their chins raised high as they explained their accomplishments to the other 200 women at the camp. The event coordinator said that this particular portion of the weekend camp is always one of the first to fill up. We were immediately invited back next year and I encourage anyone that hasn't helped with this type of event to volunteer.
