






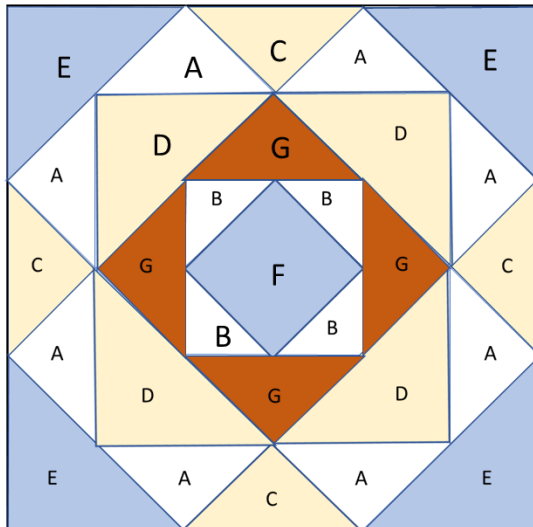
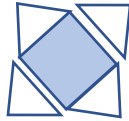

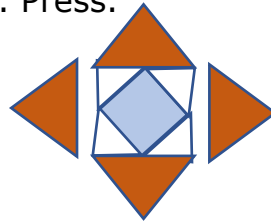
Fabric	# of squares	Size	Cut	Result
Light A:	4	3 5/8"	square only	
B:	2	2 7/8"	diagonally once	
Medium C:	1	5 1/4"	diagonally both ways	
D:	1	6 3/4"	square only	
Medium E:	2	4 7/8"	diagonally once	
F:	1	3 3/8"	square only	
Dark G:	1	5 1/4"	diagonally both ways	



1. Gather the F square and (4) B triangles. Sew the B triangles onto the F square. Sew opposite sides on first, press, then attach the other two sides. Press.

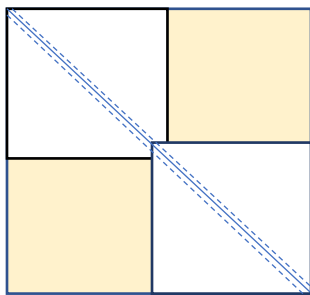


2. Gather the (4) G triangles and the B/F combination you just completed. Sew the G triangles onto the B/F combination. Sew opposite sides on first, press, then attach the other two sides. Press.

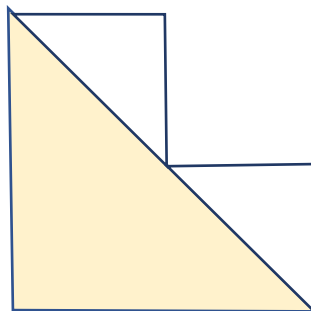


3. Let's make some flying geese. Gather the D square and the (4) A squares. We will sew them together using the Lazy Girl Flying Geese method.

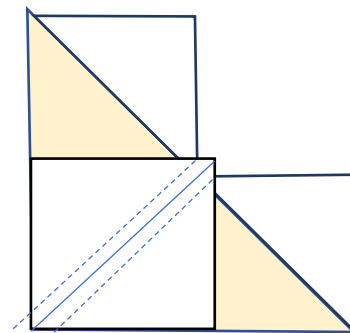
Draw a diagonal line on two of the A squares. Place them—corners touching—on top of the D square and stitch $\frac{1}{4}$ " on either side of the drawn line (step 1). Cut apart on the drawn line and press open (step 2). Now, place another A square on top of the now D triangle area in step 2, covering its corner. Draw diagonal line across this A square and stitch $\frac{1}{4}$ " on either side (step 3). Repeat step 3 with other section. Cut on drawn line and press open. Ta-dah! 4 flying geese. Lazy Girl Flying Geese Ruler has clear directions.
