From Your President

Paying attention.

There is probably no finer tribute than remembering someone. It is an extension of paying attention to the person during life. Everyone craves attention. That attention can be anything from having a pleasant conversation with a complete stranger to being elected president. In a famous experiment conducted in a Chicago area factory more than 80 years ago we accidently learned the power and potential of paying attention to others.

The original object of the study was to determine whether improved lighting and other changes in the factory would result in increased productivity. This required substantial interaction between the low-paid, poorly educated factory workers and the well-educated, sophisticated sociologists conducting the study. After dividing the workers into two groups, one group experiencing changes, the other group having had no changes made to their work setting; the workers were interviewed before, during and after the study. They were asked questions. Their answers were important. Soon, the workers began to believe they were important, far more so than before the study. Quickly, both groups of workers produced more, made fewer errors and had much better morale. Ultimately, the sociologists determined that the lighting and other changes had nothing to do with the improved performance in the factory. What mattered was that people perceived to be important (sociologists) were paying attention to, listening to and valuing the thoughts of the low-wage, poorly educated workers.

Elton Mayo, the sociologist in charge of the study

concluded that workers' performance was improved as a result of increased attention from superiors, clients or colleagues. Mayo's study, originally expected to take a year to complete, was extended over a five-year period to help the researchers understand the causes of the increased productivity.

Paying sincere, positive attention to another is easy and risk-free. Letting someone else know that you see them as someone important can plant a seed from which may grow a forest of hope and inspiration, especially among those whose emotional development has been stunted from an absence of compliments, encouragement and attention. Those whose lives you touch will always fondly remember you, paying you the finest ultimate tribute.

South Trail —— Fire And Rescue

Your South Trail Fire District. The month of February brings a change in leadership at the South Trail Fire District as Fire Chief William Lombardo retires and Assistant Chief Benjamin Bengston becomes the new fire chief. We thank

Chief Lombardo for his 30 years of dedicated service to the district and welcome new Fire Chief Bengston. As we introduce a new South Trail fire chief, this is a good time to re-introduce you to your South Trail Fire and Rescue District.

The Florida Legislature established the South Trail Fire and Rescue District in 1976 as an independent taxing district, governed by a five-member Board of Fire Commissioners elected to four-year terms by the citizens of the district. The district provides fire protection and rescue services to approximately 62,000 residents of a 55-mile square area in South Fort Myers that includes JetBlue Stadium, Hammond Stadium, Gulf Coast Hospital, and Bell Tower Shops. District funding is provided primarily by ad valorem property taxes, with some restricted funding provided by new development impact fees.

The South Trail Fire District operates four fire stations, staffed by three shifts of 22 firefighters, 24 hours a day and 365 days a year. All firefighters are emergency medical technicians, and 26 firefighters are practicing paramedics. Most district fire trucks provide Advanced Life Support (ALS) level of care for medical emergencies. In 2017, South Trail firefighters responded to 9,565 calls – 76 percent of calls were for medical emergencies. The district does not charge for any emergency response, including medical emergencies.

You can learn more about your South Trail Fire District by attending the monthly Board of Fire Commissioner meetings. The meetings are held at 5:30 p.m. on the third Monday of every month, except in January and February when the meeting is held on the third Tuesday. You can also learn more about your fire district by participating in the ride along program. If you are over 18, you can apply to ride along on emergency calls with the firefighters.

All four of the South Trail Fire District fire stations are open for station and fire apparatus tours. You may ring the station doorbell and ask for a tour, or you can call ahead and request a time to visit and spiritual/Buddhist paintings that evoke the antithesis of war. Dream Peace will also feature S(he) Will Fade: A Theatrical Ethnography, a performance art group that takes true survivor stories of sexual violence and retells them or transforms them into art.



It is February and what happens in this month? We know it is Valentine's Day on the 14th. It is also Library Lover's Month, and National Hot Breakfast Month. It is also American Heart Month so let's do some extra walking to help our heart. It is also Fabulous Florida Strawberry Month and Avocado and Banana Month. The one I am interested in is National Cherry and Cranberry Month. I have a really great recipe for Meatball and Cranberry Appetizer. It's very easy and so good. Let's take a look.

Meatball And Cranberry Appetizer (It can also be done in a slow cooker.)

2 packages (16 ounces each) appetizer-size frozen fullycooked meatballs

1 can (14-ounce) whole berry cranberry sauce

1 cup Bull's Eye barbecue sauce (also can use chili sauce) $\frac{1}{2}$ cup fresh or frozen cranberries

 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup onion, chopped fine

1 tablespoon of lemon juice

Combine ingredients except for meatballs in a pot. Heat on medium for about 5 minutes; stirring continuously. Add

the meatballs and stir to evenly coat meatballs in the sauce. Continue cooking on slow heat for about 30 to 40 minutes or until meatballs are cooked throughout. Serve in a small heated cook pot with toothpicks on the side or small plates. **Cooking The Meatballs In A Slow Cooker**

Spray sides of slow cooker. Add the sauce that you have mixed. Stir sauce and add the frozen meatballs. Cover and cook on low for about four hours. Stirring several times to coat the meatballs with the cranberry sauce. Can be served in the slow cooker.

If you prefer you can use one cup of currant jelly instead of the cranberry sauce.





Lee County Yard Waste Regulations

- Do not place out for pickup more than 24 hours early.
- Yard waste must be containerized (50 pounds or less), or . securely tied into bundles not heavier than 50 pounds and no longer than 6 feet in length.
- Up to 50 pounds of unbundled palm fronds may be placed at . the curb. Any excess palm fronds must be tied into bundles, each weighing 50 pounds or less.
 - When using plastic bags, make sure that the contents can be easily identified by the refuse truck driver (leave a twig or small branch sticking out).
- Call 239-337-0800 for a cost estimate for large-scale yard waste disposal projects when containerizing or bundling is difficult.
