SERMON OF THE MONTH Three Views

Perhaps in this beginning of the year we stand as Moses did when he was led to the top of Nebo for a spectacular view of the Promised Land. For standing there he could also see the vast area of desert from which the people had just come. He was standing in a place where he could clearly view places which refreshed his memory of glorious victory and some defeats. While standing in such a place, a clear view of the past, present and future possessions were his. As his eye eagerly absorbed the view of the Promised Land sad words from the voice of God fell upon him. What a tragedy that Moses, a mighty leader who had known God face to face, would hear the words, " . . . but thou shalt not go over thither." Duet. 34:4.

It is not my intent to discuss the reasons why Moses was prevented from entering the Promised Land. I merely wanted you to see that Moses was standing in a place where he could see: 1. Where he had been; 2. Where he stood at that moment: 3. Where he could have been. The event came at the end of a colorful and eventful life for Moses. Had he been privileged to get the same view several years earlier, who knows what different action a man of his ability and humbleness before God might have taken? Although it was not given to Moses to have this unusual view earlier in life, we today, who have just crossed the threshold of 1955 can take advantage of a similar view.

The past holds blessings of which we all like to think. There have been God-given experiences which have brought us to the place where we stand today. Along with the blessings of yesterday are the blunders, failures and mistakes. We can clearly see them now and can praise God they are in the past! From our present vantage point we can see in many instances what event led us

into the blunder or failure or blessing. Learning from the past is nothing new. Reflection upon past events has guided many men of the business world into success. His reflection taught him how to avoid the pitfalls. Thus, the future becomes a challenge; a golden opportunity; and each day the "chance of a lifetime." No matter what may have been discouraging to Moses in the past, a look into the Promised Land would have cheered him on had it not been for those fateful words as he gazed at Canaan.

Can you apply this to your own life? Can you, from where you presently stand, look back into the past years and see where God dealt with you? As you look back you may almost re-live some trial, hardship or testing that came your way. There is also the rejoicing for every blessing from the Lord. He has never failed you one time throughout all the years, has He? He kept every promise. As you shift your view to your present standing do you find yourself where you would like to be? Are you standing before God where you thought you would be a year ago? At this moment you can let Paul's words resound in your ears, "Examine yourselves, whether ye be in the faith; prove your ownselves." II Cor. 13:5. As you look at yourself it is easy to see what God has done for you. He has given you a testimony of sins forgiven; He has enabled you to overcome sinful habits; and He has helped you to see His will and His way is best in all things. Compare these and many other things with what you would have been if God had not come into your life. This helps you decide now if you are where you should be before Him. How do you stand before Him at this moment?

Personal failure to pray, to read the Word of God, to bear a burden for the lost, to lose yourself in the work of God, all point to where you

stand at this moment. Where you could be in God if you had not lost those moments He gave you to act by faith is forcibly impressed upon your heart by seeing what faith has accomplished for others. Hebrews 11. Where you could be. . . . if. So many things might be added. But not having accomplished your desire does not compel you to decide never to try again. For your encouragement rests in the view into what God has promised and you know that only one thing could ever cause you to hear those terrible words that Moses heard. Those words, "thou shalt not go over thither" will only ring in your ears if in your heart there is unbelief.

Can you picture yourself as the Christian you would like to be? God's grace will enable you to become that person in 1955. First, prepare your life for His blessing. "Enlarge stretch forth spare not, lengthen strengthen" are words found in Isa. 54:2. Let each one of the church do what is commanded here and the faith of each one will be met by a bountiful God wo loves to bless His people when they prepare for his blessing. In all this elaborate preparation you have the promise of the last verse in the same chapter; "No weapon that is formed against theee shall prosper; and every tongue that shall rise against thee in judgment thou shalt condemn. This is the heritage of the servants of the Lord, and their righteousness is of me, saith the Lord." Doesn't it give you confidence for the future to know that as you are enlarging your borders and stretching forth to do more for God that He has promised opposing weapons would not prosper and condemning tongues shall be condemned in judgment. He does not promise to let us be free from those opposing forces. He just lets us know we shall not suffer defeat from them.

In preparing for the future you are to "spare not." Do not spare yourself in prayer. Pray as though you might be the only one upon whom the fate fo your community rests. Prepare yourself in the Word of God by looking for yourself at the promises He has made for you. Refuse to allow yourself to depend upon manmade promises. When you have seen

IMAGES OF WORSHIP

READ Deut. 4: 12-19.

—Ye heard the voice of the words, but saw no similitude—.

We need most today to hear the voice of the Lord. They heard the voice but saw no likeness of God, no form, no image, just the voice. From this it is most evident that Christ should be apprehended by the spirit, rather than by the eyes. The commandments were given, the statutes and judgments pronounced -out of the fire the Lord spake, but they saw no form. We today must know of the true fire of God and seek from its light and warmth. The form we need not see. I cannot see Jesus. Jesus left no pictures of Himself, the artists have their idea. I have no image of Jesus, I do not need one. I have what I need, that is Jesus, His word, His presence, His witness. Man, beast, bird nor fish cannot be a symbol. This is a day of worshipping man, in the form of a movie star, or a great religious or political leader, but God wants us to worship Him in spirit and in truth. We are to be a people of His own possession, having no other idols or fancy of worship. The heavens declare the glory of God, but we cannot worship them. If we will please Him perfectly we will look unto Him alone, for He is God and besides Him there is none other.

Fight--

Webster gives us these definitions of the word, fight: a violent physical struggle for victory; contest; to attempt to defeat or subdue an enemy; to act in opposition to anything; to contend; to carry on or wage a battle. I understand from these definitions that a fight is not a pleasant affair. There seems to be so much fighting going on throughout the world, that I felt it would be good to try and come to a better understanding of the fighting business. The first question that would arise is, "should Christians fight?" With this question as the basis of our thinking let us look to the Word of God and see what we can find concerning this fighting business.

James 4:1-3, "From whence come wars and fighting among you? Come they now hence, even of your lusts that war in your members? Ye lust, and have not; ye kill, and desire to have, and cannot obtain: ye fight and war, yet ye have not, because ye ask not. Ye ask, and receive not, because ye ask amiss, that ye may consume it upon your lusts." It seems that this article is beginning with questions. Here James starts this fourth chapter with a question, "From whence come wars and fightings among you?" James answers this with the next question, "Come they now hence, even of your lusts that war in your members?" Wars and fightings come from the lust and greed of men in power and authority. This is true of kingdoms, nations, states, communities, homes, and individuals. Not only does war and fightings come from the lust of those in power and authority, but wars and fightings come from those who desire power and authority. Therefore wars and fightings come from lust. The uncontrolled desires of humans. Oh, the wars that could have been avoided if humans had not been so full of lust.

Can we get away from fighting? I say, no. If all the struggle by military might was stopped in the world there would still be fighting. If all the fighting was stopped in the world, (I speak of physical combat),

there would still be fighting. There would be a battle of great minds going on continually. James mentions another battle that will continue to rage: and that is the war in our members. As long as there are humans there will be fighting, one way or another. Life is a fight, it makes no difference how we look at life. Our daily existence is a fight. Since we can not get around the fight then we need to apply our efforts in the proper manner. I well remember the controversy in Korea over General McArthur. I feel that McArthur was correct in this opinion: the reason for fighting is to win. Any time that an individual loses the desire to win, that individual has no real incentive to life. People fight to obtain prestige in this world. The majority of people say, that is good. People fight to obtain prestige at the throne of God. The majority of people say, that is silly. Paul, what do you think about this? I Corinthians 9:25-27, "And every man that striveth for the mastery is temperate in all things. Now they do it to obtain a corruptible crown; but we an incorruptible. I therefore so run, not as uncertainly; so fight I, not as one that beateth the air; but I keep under my body, and bring it into subjection; lest that by any means, when I have preached to others, I myself should be a cast-away." Paul found this life to be a fight, and especially the Christian life. Paul said, so fight I. Beloved I wish to take my place in the fight with this great Apostle to the Gentiles. Paul if you had to fight, then I am ready to fight. I am not speaking of a corruptible crown. People with the improper thinking have fought and died for corruptible crowns. Oh, let us see the benefits of fighting and winning an uncorruptible crown, Eternal Life.

Wars and brawlings come from human lusts and covetousness. These kind of fightings are not pleasing to God; but there is fighting that is pleasing to God and with this, God sanctioned, fighting we shall never overcome. Paul left us a good example as he wrote to the Corinthians, So fight I, not as one that beateth the air. Perhaps it would be good if we would take a bit of inventory to see if we are doing the proper fighting or just beating the

air. Paul told young Timothy how to fight. I Timothy 6:12, "Fight the good fight of faith, lay hold on eternal life, whereunto thou art also called, and hast professed a good profession before many witnesses." The Christian fight is a faith fight. Jesus healed the High Priests servant after Simon Peter had cut off his ear and was admonished by Jesus to put up his sword. This sort of fighting is not the fight of faith. I suspect that too many people are trying to win the battle of life with the attitude of Simon Peter, and need to be admonished by Jesus to put up their sword. The Spirit of God can do more than the sword any day. Ephesians 6:12, "For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places." Here Paul gets to the real part of the Christian fight. The spiritual fight is much more important than the physical fight. Physical combat never gains friends. Physical combat creates enemies. Spiritual combat makes enemies of the Devil's gang; but it makes friends of the Lord and his servants. Spiritual combat makes for strong character and strong character is most needed always. Spiritual fighting, on the winning side makes for overcoming grace and a laying hold on eternal life. Whether we wish it to be so or not we just as well get to fighting the good fight of faith. No one will ever make it through the pearly gates without fighting the good fight of faith. We just as well get on our battling togs or the Devil will beat us out of all our blessings and the gift of Eternal Life. The Devil likes to run into a quitter but God frowns upon quitters. Luke 9:62, "And Jesus said unto him, no man, having put his hand to the plough, and looking back, is fit for the kingdom of God." The captain of our salvation says, "Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world." Words of great meaning. Yet, even these cannot suffice to give the true impression of our Father's greatness.

Think back upon the great events depicted in the Bible. The creation of the heavens and earth, the deliverance of the children of Israel out of bondage, the destruction of the wicked cities, Sodom and Gomorrha, the sacrifice of His Son — Jesus Christ — just to name a very few. If you will study them closely and visualize the actual occurences of those stories, you will see how meager are the descriptive titles above. Yet these are four of the best our language provides.

But, for all His greatness, cannot the least intelligent among us understand Him? Does it necessarily take learned men to teach us of Him? Can we not see His greatness in evidence every time we open our eyes? In every breath we take.

Place yourself in the part of a person, who, having had no spiritual teachings in early life, is asked whether or not he believes in God. Before answering take a good look around you. View the vastness of the world in which you live, and ask yourself, "Could this have happened by accident as some say?" Then, look upon yourself and ask, "Is there no more to this 'Soul' within me than just to live for a hundred years or less and then nothingness?" While making your decision you might list a few attributes as to what you think God would be like. Certainly, He would be all-powerful, just, destroyer of evil, and possess a great love for mankind. In the Bible you will find those same characteristics time and time again.

If you decide in favor of the Father, you could not help but believe in His word. But would you live by it? Would you attend His House as frequently as you could? Would your daily living habits show a lack of spiritual thoughts? Would you keep his commandments or would you "conveniently" overlook them?

Remember, life eternal is the re-

ward! Would it not be worthwhile to serve Him? — What do you think?

As our Saviour "went about doing good" and "gave Himself for us, that He might redeem us from all iniquity, and purify unto Himself a peculiar people, zealous of good works," let us follow His footprints and work for the betterment

I don't imagine I will ever forget the good time I had here, at the Bible School, C amp Meetings, Youth Camps, Convocations and other occasions. The past two months (on other times also) I had the privilege of visiting various churches and talking about the missionary work in India and in all places I received a warm welcome. Also words cannot express my appreciation and sincere thanks for everything you have done and are doing for me and the work in India. May God bless

you and reward you abundantly and strengthen your hands to help the needy, is my prayer.

Spenard Chapel Has 7th Anniversary

Sunday, November 28 marked the seventh anniversary of the Spenard chapel and for the Rev. and Mrs. Robert G. Palmer, the realization of a dream come true.

The Palmers, working in evangelistic work since 1942, traveled throughout the states before teaming up with the Rev. and Mrs. G. K. Reese in 1947 to continue their work in Alaska.

The Palmers and Reeses arrived in Spenard in 1947 from Webb City, Mo., with plans to spend one year in the territory in their work. Now seven years and much hard work later, the Rev. Mr. Palmer is pastor of the Spenard chapel, the first church built in Spenard.

The Spenard of seven years ago presented quite a different picture than the growing metropolis of today. The Palmers and Reeses found that the community had no churches, and only three businesses, Parker's department store, the Lena Hanson grocery and Bill's grocery.

Pooling their funds, these two far-sighted clergymen and their families began constructing a small frame home, where they later conducted their first Sunday School serivces for the youth of Spenard in November of 1947.

Word of the church began to reach Spenard residents through a radio program, "The Shield of Faith" sponsored by the chapel, and through personal calls made to their home by the Rev. Mr. Palmer and the Rev. Mr. Reese. After conducting Sunday school for approximately one month, with the membership of 29, the men began conducting morning and evening church services each Sunday. These services were conducted for three months, with only the pastors and their wives attending, before the church began to grow.

During those discouraging first months, the two families refused to give up. Through faith and hard work they built the church as it is today.

Construction of the Spenard chapel, which now stands at the corner of Wieler and Spenard roads began in 1948, with first church services held in the basement of the church in 1949 to a congregation of 75. Today's chapel, a shining example of faith has seen its seventh birthday.

The Sunday school, with nine trained teachers, has an average attendance of 160, with approximately 100 members attending church services each Sunday. The Rev. Mr. Palmer and Mrs. Palmer are assisted by the Rev. and Mrs. J. D. Ray, who came to Spenard early in 1954.

The Palmers, both of Webb City, Mo., were married in 1944, and traveled extensively in the states in revival work before coming to new fields in Alaska. They make their home on Wieler avenue, and have three children, Mark, 5; Ann 3, and Nancy, 2.

A NEW EXPERIENCE FOR ME TO SEE THE WIFE BAPTIZE HER HUSBAND

A country church at a Ranch Home, has made history not only for the North Plains but for the coming generation. Sister Greever is the pastor of the only country church of its kind, in the Panhandle of Texas. A beautiful little church in the garage, adjacent to the farm home and dedicated to the cause of Christ. This is an ideal central location for the community, for those who want to come and worship are welcomed with outstretched hands to administer to the spiritual needs of those who want to worship with God-fearing people.

The day was ideal and seemed to be set apart for this particular ocassion. A day that will never be forgotten. This was the closing of a successful revival, with the baptising at 2:30 p. m. As the crowd circled around the tank on the farm, then the reading of the scripture began with songs and prayers to follow. Sister Greever and the Evangelist Rev. K. Kerr walked out into the water waist-deep. The girls and ladies were baptized first and the men followed last.

This new experience to me, was to see a woman preacher stand on one side of the candidate and the Evangelist stand on the other side. They both participated in the ceremony. To see the tears and hear the shouts as they came out of the water, was a blessing to my heart and soul which I will never forget. When Brother Greever walked down into the water and to see the smiles of joy written on their faces as Mrs. Greever's hands were lifted in the air with the powerful prayer which fell from her lips, was like the drippings off of the altar of God that blessed the congregation. Another new experience to me was to see a man baptized by his wife after he had passed the three-quarter century mark. I have my doubts if there is

another case on record like this one. It was thrilling as well as inspiring, to see heaven and earth brought together in the serving of Christ through conversion and baptism.

Back to the church with a full congregation from different towns and some from Oklahoma, the communion was observed with an invitation to all to participate in the memory of Christ's death. The bread and wine representing His death, was placed on the table near the altar. The people walked up to the altar by twos. Mrs. Greever standing behind the pulpit with smiles and tears of joy manifested for the people. On either side stood a preacher praying the blessings on all who had partaken of the sacrement.

Twice in my life I have witnessed foot-washings. At the little country church they had the old time ceremonial foot-washing. The women stayed in the church while the men retreated to the kitchen. When the men began to take off their shoes. someone spoke up and said, "Are we just going to wash one foot?" The Evangelist said, "The Bible says feet." Then both shoes were removed. I caught the glimpse of the spirit that Jesus taught in humbling Himself to the place of washing the disciples feet was the last command Jesus gave here on earth. As these brethern washed each other's feet and the prayers of concescration were offered, it lifted my heart and soul into the third heaven, with the beauty of humility and the sacredness of being willing to serve humanity to the utmost, from the greatest to the least.
