

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CFJM Real Estate Review

The Dallas-Fort Worth and North Texas economy was described as "The economic center of the Sunbelt", by renowned Texas economist Ray Perryman in a presentation at a recent Dallas Regional Chamber of Commerce breakfast.

"The Sunbelt has been and will continue to be the fastest growing part of the country", according to Mr. Perryman. "In Dallas-Fort Worth, the economy is strong, job growth is solid and the housing and office markets are robust".

Texas Comptroller, Glenn Hegar, also spoke at the Chamber breakfast. According to Mr. Hegar, "The State adds 1,250 people a day and over half of them move here". "Texas boasts the 12th largest economy in the word – bigger than Australia and soon to overtake Canada", Hegar said. And, "For 105 months in a row, Texas unemployment has been lower than the national average".

With its booming economy and the large numbers of people moving to the area, the Dallas-Fort Worth and North Texas region has become one of the most active real estate markets in the nation.

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News from Aikin Elementary

Ten Things You Should Know About Aikin Elementary

- Aikin has 739 students from 29 countries. Twenty-five languages are spoken.
- Twenty-five percent of Aikin's teachers have earned or are working on their Masters.
- On the 2014-2015 STAAR test, Aikin received a distinction for Academic Achievement in Reading/ELA. Schools were not eligible for a distinction in Math because of new math TEKS.
- Heath Anderson, our Sixth Grade Science teacher, was nominated for STARS teacher and has moved on to the final round of selection.
- Aikin's extracurricular activities include: Choir, Art Club, Library Club, Walking Club, Istation Breakfast Club, Cheerleaders, and our Aikin Basketball team, who went 12-0 last year and is 4-0 at this time.
- Aikin's PTA currently has 326 members, which is our five year high.
- Our computer lab was recently up-dated with new furniture, desktop Mac computers, Mac books, iPads2 Apple TVs, and a BenQ projector.
- Two teachers work with 18 children with Dyslexia using the MTA program.
- An oak tree was planted in memory of Sanford Mitchell, a 22 year volunteer at Aikin.
- Our Pre-K students make sure our school garden thrives. They have grown broccoli, brussel sprouts, cabbage, and okra, just to name a few.
