Nature Abhors a Vacuum

*This idiom is used to express the idea that empty or unfilled spaces are unnatural as they go against the laws of **nature** and physics. -Aristotle*

I am not one to beat around the bush my friends. Pastor McNutt's absence will be felt. He knows more about theology and correct biblical teaching than anyone I have ever met. Bar None. It is funny as I type this I can hear my fellow elder and good brother Jim saying "So what do we do man?" And I'm thinking the same thing! To which I have a partial answer which will follow shortly. But first I want to show how this scientific/philosophical saying works biblically. Nature abhors a vacuum and we are all part of nature.

Let's look at Isaiah 45:18-19 which reads "For thus says the LORD, who created the heavens (He is God!), who formed the earth and made it (He established it; **He did not create it empty, He formed it to be inhabited!**): "I am the LORD, and there is no other. I have not spoken in secret, from somewhere in a land of darkness; I have not said to Jacob's descendants, 'Seek Me in vain.' I, the LORD, speak the truth; I declare what is right."

So saying nature abhors a vacuum or as the bible says "empty space" is biblical. God did not create the earth to be empty He formed it to be inhabited by all kinds of stuff, animals, plants, air, fire, and water and we were to be its caretakers.

Now let's jump back to our current situation right here at St. Paul's. How can we begin to fill in this vacuum; and since vacuum is predominantly a "cleaning" word now, let's use the idea of a deep hole in the earth.

I want you to visualize with me a real giant hole in the ground, it's DEEP. Right beside this giant hole however is an enormous pile of dirt as there often is. I want you to look closer at the dirt and rocks and roots and see a bunch of shiny silver shovels of all shapes and sizes. They are all just sitting in the dirt waiting for someone to pick one up.

Outside of the sanctuary we have a giving tree posted on the bulletin board, waiting for you to take a leaf, grab one of those metaphorical shovels and start shoveling! We have, or soon will have, openings in our council in Missions and Ministry, Stewardship, and Buildings and Grounds. Each one of those positions, as written in our church constitution, should have a committee that the council member reports to and from on all things related to the council and the church. **YOU CAN CHOOSE THE SIZE OF YOUR SHOVEL!** If you don't want a council position shovel, you can pick a different shovel as a committee member. I know this congregation has an enormous wealth of abilities, dedication for God, and time for Jesus, however we need to pick up those shiny shovels and get to work.

If anyone has an interest in helping out in any way, shape or form, that is the Spirit telling you to grab a shovel. Please respond to that call, and contact any one of the elders or council members. And thank you for shoveling with me.

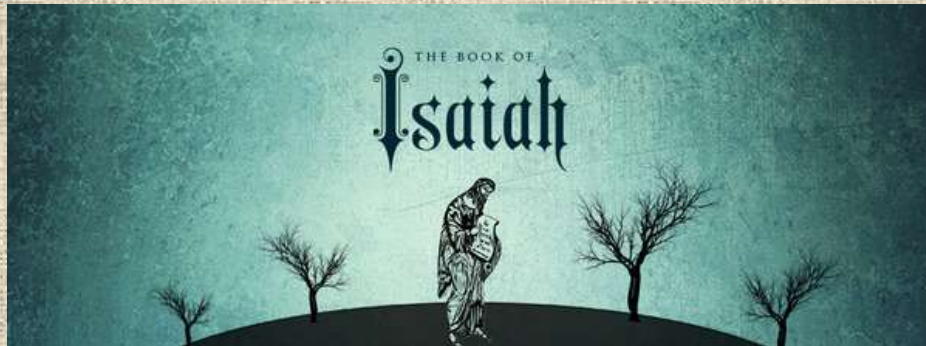

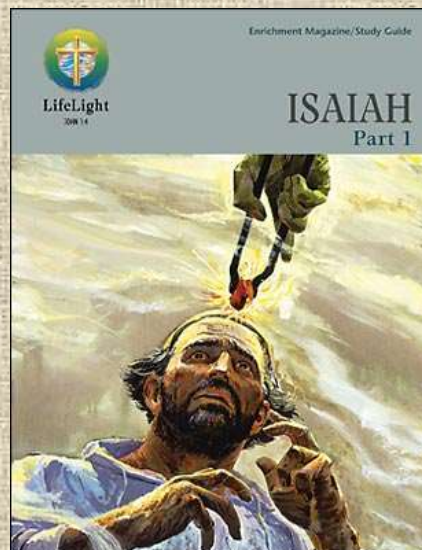
and we will be studying the book of Isaiah and
