TCSF SUMMER SCHOOL PROGRAM

TCSF operates the Temple City Summer School Program serving students in grades K-12. TCSF Summer School provides tuition-based courses for credit and non-credit in academics and enrichment. To facilitate the summer program, TCSF rents facilities from TCUSD, as well as equipment and materials owned by the District.

<u>Grades K-8 Enrichment Programs</u>: TCSF offers a mix of academic and enrichment subjects with hands-on exploration to help prepare students for the upcoming year and enhance their learning experience.

Grades 5-8 Band and Orchestra: Music Education continues in the summer with both Intermediate and Advanced courses being offered to grades 5-8. These classes offer an extended time frame for students to improve their skills in a fun filled summer program. If you are not sure if you should enroll for the "Intermediate" or "Advanced" Band or Orchestra classes, please check with Mr. Smith or Mr. Taylor before registering.

<u>Grades 2-9 Musical Theatre</u>: This is a "Junior Musical" performing arts experience. This class is looking for actors, singers, and dancers to perform at Temple City High School as part of the annual Summer Musical Theatre training program

TCSF CANCELLED CLASSES

Unfortunately, classes that do not meet enrollment requirements may be cancelled by TCSF. This process can occur in late May or early June. If TCSF must cancel a class, the parent or the guardian will be notified and have the option to select another available class, or request a refund for the full tuition of the cancelled class. The processing fee is not refundable.

FULL CLASSES & WAITING LISTS

When a class becomes full it will no longer appear as a choice during the process of Registration. Each year there are several classes where enrollment is competitive and the course becomes full shortly after registration begins. If facilities and qualified teachers are available, TCSF will open an additional section on that class. Unfortunately, it is not always possible to meet the demand for a particular class when it becomes full. Occasionally a student will cancel their registration, freeing up a spot in that class. You can add you name to the Waitlist for the desired class during registration. This is a first-come, first-served list of requests. You will be notified if a spot becomes available in the class of your choice.
