President's Letter – May 2016

I don't think it was a cheap poor repro switch but then again it was not an original as far as I could tell. Notice the bluish burn color on the cover. Lucky that I carry a spare switch and was on my way fifteen minutes later. This was a heavy dead short, it drained a lot of the power in my battery in a short amount of time. My ammeter showed a lot of charging after restarting for quite some time.





Make your own tool to easily and quickly adjust free play.

When adjusting your clutch pedal free play this tool comes in handy to remove and replace the clevis pin by using leverage to overcome the spring pressure.

To make first start with 1/2" round bar stock 14" long. Bend one end around a 1" pipe using an acetylene or oxygen propane torch. Weld another 1 1/2" piece of 1/2 " round bar on the side 2" down from the top. You then hook over the arm and push up.



April Clinic

Our Thursday night clinic featured the MARC drivers mileage awards being handed out to three of our members.We had Mr.Steve Moen from the Martin Seymour paint company as our guest speaker.His presentation explained to us the basic manufacturing process used to create paints, the strong manufactures commitment to quality and the technical support available to those who work with the products. We learned how laquer paint originally used on our cars has been substituted for new products for increased durability and increased productivity in it's application time. New water based paints and color matching by machines and people were explained. A lot of information was given out by Mr. Moen and he suggested the possibility of actually doing something hands on perhaps at a near by technical school. This would further help us understand the paint products and the process of application. The presentation was well received and for those of us who may never actually paint a car the basic information and science may help us to make better decisions when we face the time our cars need to be painted.

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FUEL TANK CLEANING PRESENTATION

Jim Bateman has been working on a dirty fuel tank issue. He has a pickup that has sat for a long time without it being used and like many Model A's the fuel tank has a lot of rust in it leading to problems. Jim is cleaning the tank by the electrolysis process. He uses a detergent, washing soda and a battery charger connected to an anode in the tank. The process pulls the rust through the detergent solution to a steel rod (the anode). He then scrapes the accumulated rust of the anode and continues the process. The amount of rust he has removed is very impressive . Although not an overnight process he is making good progress and will keep us informed. Jim brought a gas tank that was cut away to show us where the rust develops and the hidden areas behind the baffles.




A large accumulation of rust that Jim has so far removed from the tank
