

# BY LAWS OF THE Apostolic Faith Bible College, Inc. ARTICLE VII

Doctrine

It is recognized that the true church of Jesus Christ consists of all believers who believe in the saving grace of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and who have accepted Him as their personal Savior. It is recognized and agreed that no organization or man has been granted authority by the Lord to exclude from or accept anyone into the Kingdom of Heaven, as this is done by Jesus Christ only. It is further recognized and agreed that we as Christians are to love all members of the Body of Christ (Christians), and this love and fellowship derives from the unity instilled by the Holy Spirit. Although differences in doctrinal beliefs and interpretations should not influence our love for one another, adherence to similar doctrinal beliefs and modes of worship have bonded together those of the Apostolic Faith Movement as founded by Charles F. Parham in the early 1900's. The scripture teaches us to adhere to the truth and proper doctrine. The common doctrinal beliefs are essentially as follows.

- Triune God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
- Creation and Formation.
- Man is basically sinful and in need of Salvation.
- Salvation by Grace upon repentance toward God and acceptance of Jesus Christ as one's personal Savior, which is the conception of Spiritual Life.
- Sanctification of the Spirit, Soul and Body, A second definite work of Grace by the Lord Jesus Christ.
- Baptism of the Holy Spirit; evidenced by the speaking in other languages.
- Water Baptism (of all believers) by immersion in water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
- Sacrament of the Lord's Supper.
- Washing of Feet.
- Divine Healing through Jesus Christ for all believers.
- Do not condone divorce and remarriage.
- Destruction of the Wicked
- Conditional Immortality.
- Rapture of the Man Child Class.
- Return of Jesus Christ to earth again; bodily and visibly.
- A ministry supported by tithes and offerings.

These doctrines shall be adhered to in the teachings of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, which in addition to other doctrinal teaching approved by the Board from time to time if they are not in consistent with the above listed basic doctrines.

#### Is There A Man In The House?

Although this lesson was inspired by a sermon that I heard a few years ago, I have since been so enlightened and convicted that I have searched the Scriptures and my heart to see 'whether these things were so.' When Sister Karen had asked me to put this lesson into written form, I gladly consented to do so for I can tell you, without a doubt, that from the Bible and personal experience, this message is right, timely, and needed.

In Ezekiel 22:23-31 is both the account and results of the sins of the Jewish people. There isn't time to examine every item described, but it's not hard to see similarities between the conditions of then and the present dilemmas of this country.

Beginning with v.25, there is a conspiracy (an unlawful alliance or treason) spoken of among her [the house of



Israel] prophets and priests-the ones that have been placed in positions of spiritual authority. They have turned from the people unto their own ways. Having failed in that responsibility, many souls have been devoured and many widows have been left. Wid-

ows here means 'discarded (as one who is divorced),' but I believe there are many women today who may just as well be termed as widows because their husband is dead. He may be there beside the woman, but he's dead spiritually. His spirit has ceased and he's inactive in the role to which God has ordained Him. The woman is discarded because the male has discarded his place.

Eze. continues, under divine inspiration, detailing more of the transgressions of 'the people of the land.' Then in v.30, God, almost with a sound of dismay, declares "I have sought (to strive after, require, desire) for a man that should make up the hedge (the enclosure representing a wall or protection) and stand (by, fast, still or up, repair) in the gap (an opening made by a parting or breaking, breach) before me in the land, that I should not destroy it: but I found none." Verse 3--"Therefore have I poured out my indignation upon them; I have consumed them with the fire of my wrath: their own way have I recompensed upon their heads (highest point, chiefest), saith the Lord God"

"I sought for a man," God says. I believe He's still seeking today for men that are to be in the positions of authority, to rise up-to stand up-to wake up and repair the openings made by sin; to be present when God needs a man to fulfill the rupture in society and the home. Beloved, there is an attack on the home and the headship of today. We see nearly half (if not more) of all marriages end in divorce. One could speak at length of the children's loss of respect for the parents in the home or the assaults of the homosexual and lesbian force that is pushing against the institution of the Family. God said 'the heads' were recompensed; they felt the consequenc-

es, as there always will be when there is a disfunctioning, neglective and abusive spirit within the family and the church (which came after the home!) The heads will be brought low when not living up to the standard of being 'the head.'

Turning now to the account of the REAL FIRST FAMILY in Genesis two and three, God is doing something marvelous. Starting with Gen. 2, after God spoke the world into existence, verse five says, 'There was not a man to till the ground.' God then takes from His creation, the earth, "And the Lord God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul." The Bible says that God planted a garden in Eden and put the man there. Verse nine speaks of the trees that God had also planted; one pleasant to the sight and the other, the tree of knowledge of good and evil. Going to V.15, the Lord God took the man and put him in the garden to dress-(to work, husbandmen) and to keep-(to attend, protect). Verses 16 & 17 concerns the instruction given to Adam not to eat of the tree of knowledge of good and evil. After this God, upon creating the world and all that therein was, 'saw that it was good.' Yet vs. 18 is the only place in these first chapters that God said that 'It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make an help-(aid, surround protect) meet-(counterpart, mate). It is that the Lord God formed every feast and fowl out of the ground (from which man came) but the woman was made from and for Adam. God took from the man the rib-(curved, from the side) and made He a woman. Certainly, then, she was bone of Adam's bone and flesh of his flesh; taken not from the head (for the husband is the head of his wife, and only his wife, not all wives!), not from his feet to be trampled on or walked over, but from the side to add support and receive covering and comfort.

Chapter Three begins, "Now, the serpent was more subtil-(crafty, cunning) than all the beasts of the field. Entering into a conversation with the woman, he asked, "has God said..." Has he really said? The woman replies to the serpent with what she's heard-that God had said that in the day they ate of the forbidden tree, they would die. This first lie is one that unregenerate man (and some Christians) still want to believe today; that no matter what God has said, no matter what we do, we shall not die.

Doubt was planted within the woman having been promised another thing which man cannot possibly achieve-that the eating of the fruit would give her godhood. Men are not 'gods' nor do they have the capability to become so. There is one God the Bible plainly states. The tragic beginning of sin was when the woman saw the seemingly goodness of the tree and the wisdom that it was supposed to give. She beheld the pleasantness of the forbidden, taking "of the the fruit thereof, and did eat and gave also unto her husband with

her, and he did eat." "And the eyes of them both were opened..." Enlightenment and conviction came with disobedience as they vainly tried to hide from God.

Verse eight begins with nine exciting words "And they heard the voice of the Lord God..." Normally, this would have been something to look forward too, but this time it was not. In verse nine the Lord called 'unto Adam and said unto him, Where are thou?" Although the woman was in the transgression, God sought for the man to take responsibility. Whatever happens in the home may not always be the man's fault, but it is his responsibility.

Remember, according to the Bible, God didn't tell the woman not to eat of the tree. She wasn't even formed until after God had given Adam instruction concerning the tree. It was Adams responsibility to tell the woman and although he may have done this, again the Bible says that Adam was with her when she took of the fruit. Adam, the man, stood there and watched his wife have a satanic encounter and did nothing about it! Women even today are encountering attacks on the family and her God-given role. When the male doesn't fulfill his role as the spiritual leader; when he stands idly by and does nothing, women have a tendency to get frustrated, angry and resentful. Satan was able to get to the woman as he did because Adam was not 'there' as he needed to be, just as the devil would have a much harder time getting to the wives if the husband's were if their place. Of course, this is not to say women can't be spiritual leaders, for I know many. Oftentimes, unfortunately, the woman has to be simply because the men aren't. Ephesians 5:23 continues (after the part men love- 'the husband is to be the head of his wife') with 'even as Christ is the Head of the Church...(25) Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ also loved the church and gave himself for it.' Adam should have been giving himself for his wife instead of her giving to him. This is opposite to what God intended. Man is supposed to give to the wife and she takes it, returning it better. He gives her groceries, she gives him a meal; he provides a house and she makes it a home; he gives her seed and she gives him a baby. Regrettably (and I believe we as a people and nation will regret it) it would seem we live in a time where we have a 'take' mentality instead of realizing our purpose in marriage should not be, 'what can I get out of it,' but 'what can I put into it?' When men don't know the proper use of a woman or their own purpose, society will continue to deteriorate. We abnormally or wrongfully use something when we are ignorant of it's purpose. To command our wives to do everything and act like a slave is a form of abuse, which is abnormal use. Also, if the husband shows disrespect and unfairness towards his wife, the children will usually follow his example. What children grow up with at home will have, generally speaking, a big impact in their own life and marriage. This may not always hold true, but one doesn't have to look far to see this. If the man or women is critical, resentful, dominating, or degrading towards the spouse, the children see that and portray it the way they deal with others.

God called, "Adam (man), where are you," (emotionally? spiritually?) Missing men or men inactive, where are you? There is no reason for men to be as absent as they are today. When God asked His second question, who told you that you were naked or exposed Adam tried (what so many of us do) self-justification. "This woman you gave to be with me, she did it! The woman also passed the blame onto the serpent who received the curse in V. 14, "and dust shall thou eat." The Lord formed man out of <u>dust</u> and even today the devil, as a roaring lion, walks about, seeking whom he can devour. The devil is attacking, especially the male seed. He tried it with Moses, and then during Christ's time, and he trying it today with a brutality called *abortion*.

Now turning to the woman, He says, "I will greatly multiply thy sorrow and thy conception; in sorrow shalt thou bring forth children: and thy desire shall be to thy husband, and he shall have rule over thee." This is the curse of the women-to have exactly the thing she didn't want imposed upon her-the rulership of the man over her when it was her desire in the first place "to be as gods." As hard as this may sound, I believe He dealt harder with Adam for this reason-the Bible says (I Timothy 2) that the man knew what he was doing and that he was not deceived, intentional sin. The curse given to the women consisted of only one verse while man's curse was given in three. Man had it 'easy' in the garden, for it was all good. But now he had "hearkened unto the voice of the wife" (which is not always a bad thing. Just make sure she is saying the right thing!), the ground would be cursed for Adam's sake. "In sorrow shalt thou eat of it all the days of your life; Thorns and thistles shall it bring forth to thee; and thou shalt eat the herb of the field; In the sweat of your face shall thou eat bread, till thou return to the ground."

Finally, in the last of the chapter, Adam names his wife Eve, because she was the mother of all living. Today, it is that there is an abortive spirit with many factors contributing to this 'alternative.' Beloved, let us realize that abortion is not always just some 'surgical procedure' done in a clinic. Many children are aborted today simply because one or both parents constantly neglect them and have aborted their own roles.

Beloved, this has to stop. America will be recompensed someday because of our sins. And God is calling out for men.

Women, instead of tearing down your husband, lift him up in prayer (if you are a praying woman). Men, act like a man and instead of walking over your wife, walk beside her, both growing in mutual respect protection and aid for each other. I sought for a man. Will you be one that will be found?

#### What Makes You Tick?

A young boy had misbehaved and had gotten a spanking. Soon afterwards, his family discovered that he was missing. After awhile his family found him out in the chicken house, sitting on the roost, with his face in his hands. They listened for a moment to what he was saying to himself. They discovered him saying, "What makes me do it -- what makes me do it?" Over and over he repeated that statement. The little boy did not understand what made him misbehave as he often did.

We too often wonder why we do certain things when we know Christians ought not do those particular things. Perhaps our attitude is not what it should be. Our reactions to a particular situation is not right. Jesus explains these things in Luke 9:51-56. Jesus told his disciples, "Ye know not what manner of spirit ye are of". These were Christian men who were operating under the influence of the wrong spirit. Many good intentional christians find themselves operating under the influence of that same, wrong spirit or a spirit very similar. The sad thing about this situation, these Christian men thought they were doing the right thing by showing loyalty to Jesus by wanting to call fire down from Heaven to destroy those who would not and did not receive Jesus and they were very rude to their friend and master. Have you ever been around a person or a group of persons and you felt they resented you being there? Sometimes you felt that they were just tolerating you and they would rather that you got lost. James and John felt this spirit of resentment, which was definitely wrong, but they also were operating under the influence of a spirit that was not right. We can be so right that at times we are wrong. There are always three sides to the story ... your side, my side and the right side.

In Numbers 13, we read that there were 12 spies sent out to spy out the land of Canaan -- Ten of the spies returned, operating under the influence of a negative spirit, which said that it was impossible for them to recover the land from the enemy. However Caleb stood up and said, "Let us go up at once, for we are well able to overcome it". What a different spirit that Caleb was operating under! Caleb was operating under the influence of the spirit of overcoming, while those other 10 were operating under the influence of the spirit of defeat. Numbers 14:24 God made this statement, "But my servant, Caleb, because he had another spirit with him and hath followed me fully, him will I bring into the land whereunto he went and his seed shall possess it." Success or defeat depends, not on the circumstances, but on the spirit which you and I are operating under.

Isa. 29:9-10 A spirit of deep sleep was poured out on the nation of Israel, a sleep that has lasted for nearly 2,000 years. Verses 11-12, the prophet explains why Israel has not been able to understand about Jesus Christ, our wonderful Savior and Lord. They rejected him, as Bethlehem's babe, therefore God poured out a spirit of sleep upon them. They are awake physically but spiritu-

ally asleep.

Daniel 5:11-12, Daniel possessed an excellent spirit ... a spirit of knowledge, understanding, interpreting of dreams, shewing of hard sentences and dissolving of doubts. Again in Dan. 6:1-3, Daniel had an excellent spirit so he was preferred above the Presidents and Princes.

Ezek. 8:3, The prophet was given a vision of the spirit of jealousy that Israel would possess after God turned against Israel and turned unto the Gentile Nations.

I Kings 22, King Ahab, King of the House of Israel, weaved a network of evil counsel for himself, which led to his ruin. Ahab preferred lies rather than the truth, so God just allowed Ahab's lies to be the instrument of punishment to him.

I Tim. 4, Some departed from the faith, giving heed to seducing spirits and doctrines of devils, speaking lies in hypocrisy. A suggestive spirit can overpower common reasoning and thereby will destroy us.

I John 4:1 We are admonished to try the spirits ... not all spirits, that saved people operate under, are of God. Everything that we do or say, is influenced by the spirit of God or the spirit of the devil.

I Cor. IO:12, "Wherefore let him that thinketh he standeth, take heed, lest ye fall." It is very necessary to understand what makes us tick! We may be well meaning and yet we may be operating under the influence of the wrong type of spirit. Let us be cautious about what spirit we are of.

Raymond died on July 17,1998 in Katy. He was born on May 25, 1923, the only son of Ben and Hazel Mineola Groendyke Barker in Beaver County, Oklahoma and the proud brother of his surviving sisters, Lorraine Fullbright, Texanna Allen, Euteva Gregory and LaMoyne Fox. His family resided in Beaver, OK., Houston, Tx., Laverne, Ok., and southern California for a period of two years.

Raymond served in the Army Air Corps for approximately 30 months as a staff sergeant for two generals and was stationed for the greater part of his service in Brazil. He was responsible for working with the FBI and Secret Service during that time to help round up approximately 130 Nazi agents living in South America and for various other administrative duties.

He married Dona Maxine Tucker on June 12,1947. He graduated from Oklahoma State University in 1948 with a Bachelors Degree in Business Administration with a major in marketing and a minor in geography. He moved to Katy in 1948 and lived the rest of his life there.

He was the dedicated father of Edward Ray Barker(deceased), Donnis Renee Mitchell, Cheryl Gae Wright and Gina LaKaye Corsi.

He was the loving grandfather of Joel Benjamin Mitchell, Lora Elizabeth Mitchell, Gia Marie Corsi, Joshua Ray Corsi, Nina Raquel Corsi andMatthew Boyce Corsi and step-grandson, Steve Wright.

Upon settling in Katy, Raymond pursued the rice farming profession, managing the Tucker Rice and Drier operations and up to four farms at one time. He was also active as a real estate investor in Houston, Tx. owning four apartment complexes. He developed several innovative approaches to land and crop management until He finally retired after 25 years of dedication to his profession. In his own words, rice farming was "good to him."

Raymond faithfully served on the Board of the Apostolic Faith Church in Katy for more than 40 years and on the advisory committee of Faith Outreach Student Center at West Texas State University(now West Texas A&M). He was also a member of the American Rice Growers Association during his active farming years.

Raymond's love, however, was for young men and women to come to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ. He accomplished this through the building and development of the Lost Pines Youth Encampment in Warda, Texas. This camp and affiliated singing schools were made possible by the generosity of the Tucker Foundation and Raymond and Dona's personal benevolence. It should be also be noted that Raymond's capacity to spend countless hours in preparation for the camps was made possible by his ability to delegate the management of the farming operations to his trusted cousin, Richard Barker, and the rice drier operations first to Ollie Nash and to Albert Lambert in later years.

Raymond's greatest passion, however, was the Word of God. He loved to study and teach, particularly in the area of prophecy. Raymond was asked to present his studies in various Apostolic Faith churches, the Apostolic Faith Bible College and meetings throughout the United States. It was a fond memory of his children watch him spend long hours in preparation for the publication of various books on related subjects.

In addition to his personal development, his legacy was one of a family history rich in the provision of members who were dedicated men and women of God who gave themselves in sacrificial ways for the sake of the commission of Christ. Raymond never looked for public affirmation of the work of the Lord. Most of the time he labored with others in obscurity. His satisfaction came from standing back and seeing the fruit of his labor manifest in the changed hearts of the children and adults that were recipients of his labor.

#### **Paul Eccles**

June 4, 1920 - January 26, 1998

Paul Eccles, the son of Raymond and Flossie Eccles, was born in Booker, Texas on June 4, 1920. He passed into rest at Ochiltree Hospice in Perryton on Monday, January 26, at the age of 77 years, 7 months.

Paul attended Booker schools where he graduated in 1939. He and Mona Russell were married in Booker on November 17,1940. Three sons were born to them: Larry, Donnie and Ronnie.



He taught many young people's Sunday School classes, helped sponsor many ski trips and retreats for Full Gospel Church teenagers-they knew he was their friend.

Paul was preceded in death by his parents and one sister, Juanita John. Survivors include his wife of the home; his sons and their wives: Larry and Joan, Ronnie and Shiela, all of Pampa, Texas; Donnie and Vicki of Beaver, Oklahoma; 5 grand-children, 8 great-grandchildren; one brother and his wife, Russell and Alice Eccles of Sapulpa, Oklahoma; two sisters, Joy Wright of Lubbock, Texas; Pauline and her husband, Dub Welch of Downey, California: many nieces, nephews, and other relatives and friends.

#### Be Ye Doers

Many today have seemingly remembered to be doers but have forgotten the next phrase, "of the word". People today seem to have a general idea that if they just belong to a church and attend Services for Easter and Christmas it makes them Christians. The rest of the time they run here and there to keep up in the Sports world, clubs of various kinds, giving fund raising dinners (even for the church) and they feel they are being doers, The only things they actually believe are my church "teachers" and they frequently speak the Lord's name when they use it for slang words.

Jesus talks of things like this in Matthew 7:21-22. Here is part of what He says, "Not every one that sayeth unto me Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven, but he that doeth the will of My Father which is in heaven." In Jesus' own words He bid us to do the will of God. Even in the Old Testament in the times of Micah he wrote "He (God) hath showed thee, O man, what is good and what doth the Lord require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?", Micah 6:8. This verse stresses living as God wants us to do while we are doing our good works. I do not mean to leave an impression that being interested in the things that are of interest to our children and young people are all wrong, but keep God first and teach them to do likewise. There is a warning in Deuteronomy 28, especially the later part, were God warns Isreal that if they do not listen to the Lord, He will allow many troubles to come upon them. Jesus goes on to say in Matthew 7:24, that whosoever does His sayings will be like a wise man who built his house on a rock and the storms of life cannot blow it down because he has built his life on the solid foundation (Christ). Then Jesus goes on to say the foolish (or those who do not heed His words) are building on sand. The things done by people who are only Christians for show or trying to live it the way that pleases themselves and when trials come along the foundation of sand will crumble and wash away.

In Ezekiel 18:4 we can read these words, "Behold, all

souls are mine, as the soul of the father, so also the soul of the son is mine; the soul that sinneth, it shall die". Verse 20, of this same chapter continues on with the same thought, but puts a different word (meaning the same thing) when it reads, "The son shall not bear the iniquity of the father, neither shall the father bear the iniquity of the son; the righteousness of the righteous shall be upon him, and the wickedness of the wicked shall be upon him. But if the wicked will turn from his sins that he hath committed and keep all my statutes, and do that which is lawful and right. He shall surely live, he shall not die." In Jesus words found in John 6:37 we can read "him that cometh unto me I will in no wise cast out," In Matthew 11:28-30 Jesus gives an invitation to anyone who will heed His words. Here Jesus says, "Come unto me, all ye that labor and are heavy laden (troubled with cares of life) and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn of me for I am meek and lowly in heart and ye shall find rest unto your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.

We need to keep in mind the words of the Prophet Isaiah when he wrote, "Seek ye the Lord while He may be found, call ye upon Him while He is near; let the wicked forsake his way and the unrighteous man his thoughts; and let him return unto the Lord, and He will have mercy upon him, and to our God, for He will abundantly pardon, For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are my ways your ways, saith the Lord." Isaiah 55:6-8.


