He graduated from the Cleveland Chiropractic College in Kansas City (thus, the nickname of "Doc") and had a successful 35+ year career as a Doctor of Chiropractic Medicine before retiring to Sun Lakes. Doc and his wife, Vera, have lived the good life in Sun Lakes for over 22 years. Vera continues to be a successful local realtor while Doc has focused on softball.

As an early member of the Sun Lakes senior softball program, Doc has helped the Association grow into the successful organization that it is today. "When Dave Boone was injured, we had no other pinch hitters, so Henry stepped in and lashed a base hit in his only plate appearance, adding to the team effort required."
