From the Desk of Rabbi Daniel Polish

Highlights of the Year



Dear Friends:

It looks like winter has finally loosened its grasp on us and the warmer weather is here to stay. As we move into summer, I have begun reflecting on the year that is passing. I want to share some highlights with you.

We shared five B'nai Mitzvah this year: Zach Wogalter, Sadie Krueger, Ryan Freedman, Lia Malley, and Sammy Rubinstein. What a treat to watch as each of them entered the process a somewhat nervous child unsure of themselves and their ability to conduct the service and emerge as a confident young adult sure of themselves, wonderfully capable of leading us in worship, with something insightful and important to teach us. I rejoiced that in a way I had the close-up opportunity of watching each of them grow up, in real time. In Sammy's case, I was reminded what a privilege it was for me as a rabbi to have officiated at her baby naming and now to stand with her as she read from the Torah.

Sharing Shabbat Torah study was different this year. At the urging of Michael Rothman, we set aside the study of the weekly Parashat HaShavuah/Sedra/Torah portion and instead picked up the story where the Book of Deuteronomy leaves off. We followed Joshua across the river Jordan and into the land and spent time with the Judges who led and protected the people during the period just before the creation of the monarchy. We got as far as the prophet Samuel about to anoint Saul as the first king. This was a chance for us to share a close reading of texts that most Jews never see, a break from reading and rereading the Five Books of Moses.

Our joint Ivrit/Hebrew school services with Temple Beth El were joyous. The Shabbaton sponsored by us, Temple Beth El and Vassar Temple offered members of all three congregations the opportunity to come together to learn. We hosted the Erev Shabbat service which was especially well attended by members of the wider community. Our guest speaker, Jane Eisner of the Forward, was insightful and challenging. We were fortunate to have been able to learn from her.

Shir Chadash brought the premier Jewish acapella group, the Maccabeats, to Poughkeepsie for a wonderful afternoon of music and entertainment. They were terrific. The audience filled the large social hall. And most importantly, everyone who attended had a wonderful time. The post-program reception was, as always, spectacular as well. The congregation owes a debt of thanks to the concert committee and to the reception committee as well.

As with every year, I rejoiced in the way we celebrate Chanukah and Purim and I thank especially the latke makers, the Hamantaschen bakers, and the cast and crew of the Purim Shpiel who turned some words on a page into a delightful and hilarious entryway into the Megillah.

And now we are coming to the end of our regularly scheduled year together as we rejoice in summer's special tempo and offerings. I hope that each of your summers is restful and fulfilling.

There is an old Midrash that when the Torah is offered to the Jewish people, G-d requests a guarantor. After kings and heroes are offered up, but rejected, the Jewish people finally suggest their children. Ah, says G-d, yes, your children will be the guarantors of my Torah.

This Midrash is always in the back of my mind. It colors all my teaching and my life's work as a Cantor. We all heed the mandate stated in the Shema to "teach them diligently to our children". There is no greater blessing than to see the ethics and wisdom of Judaism being passed down to the next generation. This year it was indeed my privilege and pleasure to work with five of our students and prepare them for Bar or Bat Mitzvah. Each one of those five students brought something special and unique to that day. Each spent weeks delving into the intricacies of their respective Torah portions. Each of them requested special music for their individual services. And, if I do say so, each and every one of them chanted the Torah and Haftarah portions beautifully and led our congregation in prayer.

One of my other joys has been working with our junior choir. There are two amazing moments that stand out for me over this year. The first was the Bar Mitzvah of Ryan Freedman. Ryan had requested that I sing a setting of the text, "L'Dor Vador" by Josh Nelson. As we have sung this over the years with our Junior Choir, I invited the Junior Choir to come up and sing it with me. However, as I looked out that morning, I saw many alumni of our Junior Choir and I invited them to come up as well. It was so touching to see some of our students who are now in college eagerly come to the Bima to join us in song. They sang clearly, proudly and with conviction. It was deeply moving for all of us in attendance.

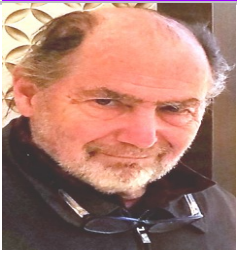

EXCITING THINGS HAPPENED IN RELIGIOUS SCHOOL!

Our teachers have once again made the Shir Chadash Religious School year special for our students. They did this with hands-on activities, computer-based activities, and active discussions.

Our youngest students had a chance to experience Tikkun Olam by baking muffins with Robbie Schiff, Andrew Scheck, and Ashley Kaswer for a Shir Chadash dinner at the Homeless Shelter. Our 4th and 5th graders learned about Shabbat services, traveled to the past through a time machine, and watched parts of “Fiddler on the Roof” to understand the programs that our ancestors endured. Our 6th and 7th graders studied the meaning of prayer and G-d in their lives, and how Jewish history has shaped our Torah and our guidelines for living. In December, all of our students led a Shabbat service, and on May 31st they will present special projects that they have been working on.

So once again I would like to thank Andrew Scheck, Rochelle Bellach, and Grace Bass who, as volunteers, have put their hearts and souls into teaching our children and teenagers. These wonderful teachers have invested much time behind the scenes in the preparation and gathering of materials, videos, and information, before they even came to class.

Thank you also to our substitute teachers: Ian Freedman, Robbie Schiff, and Jeremy Bill who have stepped up to provide guidance and encouragement to accomplish the tasks designed for those classes; and to Jeff Lash who stepped in as coordinator.

Sadie Krueger and Ashley Kaswer were our assistant teachers this year—thank you for helping out wherever you were needed. Rebecca Mullins just recently has helped out as an assistant teacher-in-training, and we look forward to her continuing interest next year as well. I hope that these students will remain active in our Religious School, so that when they go off to college, they will be able to teach Religious School in a synagogue in their college towns, and thus pass on their learning.

Finally I would like to thank Cantor Hirschenfang for the musical enrichment she offers our students in Jr. Choir; Rabbi Polish for occasionally going into the classrooms to connect with our students; and the parents of our students who have provided support, encouragement, and transportation.

Soon we will be working on next year’s program which will have a different look. Stay tuned for more information coming this summer!

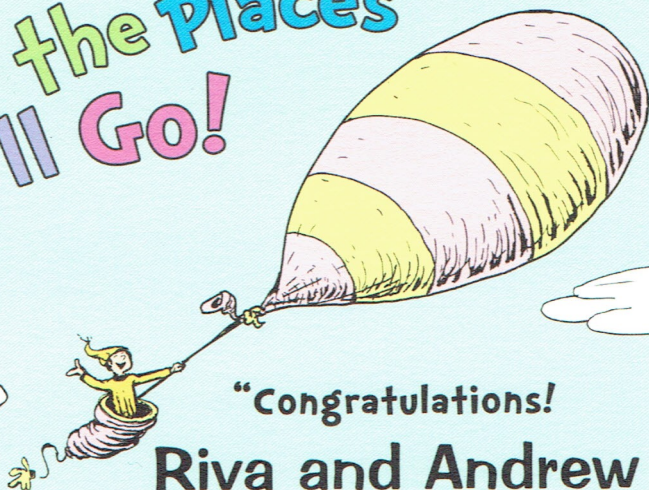

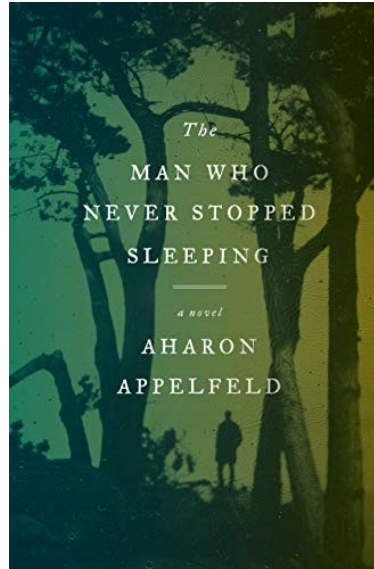

“We have been reading works by recently deceased Jewish authors. When Rabbi Polish spoke on this topic both Sandy and I realized that neither of us had read any of the over forty books by Israeli author Aharon Appelfeld.

One of his last novels is "The Man Who Never Stopped Sleeping". A very personal story of a young man, really a boy, not 18 when the story begins, who comes alone from Ukraine to Israel and lives and works on a Kibbutz literally building what was to become the state of Israel. It is not at all political, you must bring your own knowledge of world events to understand the times. Instead we see how war, separation, resettlement, learning a new language and becoming part of a developing culture affect a very introspective young adult.

I recommended this novel for our next meeting. I obtained this book from the library and it is available online, used in good condition, from Drift Book for \$5.84. I will also read *Badenheim 1939*, his most known and much earlier work, to give us more perspective.” Robbie Schiff

AHARON APPELFELD is the author of more than forty works of fiction and nonfiction, including *The Iron Tracks*, *Until the Dawn's Light* (both winners of the National Jewish Book Award), *The Story of a Life* (winner of the Prix Médicis Étranger), and *Badenheim 1939*. Other honors he has received include the Giovanni Boccaccio Literary Prize, the Nelly Sachs Prize, the Israel Prize, the Bialik Prize, and the MLA Commonwealth Award. *Blooms of Darkness* won the Independent Foreign Fiction Prize in 2012 and was short-listed for the Man Booker International Prize in 2013. Born in Czernowitz, Bukovina (now part of Ukraine), in 1932, he died in Israel in 2018.
