I sit here today remembering it was thirty years ago today that Theresa and I were married in a beautiful Baptist Church outside of Wichita Kansas. Time flies! I wish I could tell the secret to our thirty years. I'm not sure it isn't we are both too stubborn to quit, but that would make a terrible devotional. So in-

stead I will pick the only scripture about couple relationships that Paul wrote I can agree with wholeheartedly. In I Corinthians chapter 7 Paul has some directions concerning marriage that I find pretty wise for a single guy. In verse 4 he states the husband doesn't have authority over his body, his wife does and the wife doesn't have authority over her body the husband does. This statement of mutuality had to be a shocking statement back in Paul's day as a husband's authority was well established in that time, but a wife with the same rights? Shocking by the culture in which Paul lived.

A good marriage is a place where care for the other is a primary concern and a good Christian is one who places the same care on all others they meet. As a human it is natural to worry about yourself a little too much. After all you are the most important thing in your world, but Jesus set an example of service to others as a greater concern than your own being. He demonstrated servant leadership in a way that ran just as counter to culture as Paul's statement about a wife's authority over her husband. Sadly after 2,000 years of practice the church still can't get this simple concept of servant leadership correct. They are more concerned with power, control and even the very titles we use are abused. The term pastor occurs only once in the whole New Testament and even then it was from the translated word shepherd. At heart a pastor should be the one caring for the flock, but in today's church a pastor is much more likely to look like the CEO of a corporation than a shepherd and with it comes all the trappings of power and control.

It is easy to get lost in the business of the church, but I want to remind you all, you hired me as your pastor and I want to answer the biblical call to fill that role in your life. If you need me ...call. My top priority will always be your needs. Odds are I can fix very little, but I will listen and remind you God does love you and so do I. Hey! Maybe that is what makes a marriage work too, I'll try that on Theresa this week and see how it works.
