Jesus: Man of Action

At once the Spirit sent Jesus into the wilderness...

Immediately Simon and Andrew followed him.... Without delay Jesus called James and John... Right away they told Jesus Simon's mother was sick... Instantly the man with leprosy was healed...

- Mark 1:10, 18, 20, 30, 42

That is just some of what happens in the first Chapter of Mark. There are no genealogies, no long sermons, or extended conversations. From the very beginning, the Gospel of Mark is packed with action.

Matthew and Luke tell about Jesus giving sermons and spinning parables. John describes him confounding his enemies and confusing his disciples with lengthy discourses. In reading their accounts, it is easy to focus on words and miss actions. But when we imagine Jesus as being serene and unperturbed, floating above it all, Mark assures us that he understands completely what life, with all of its pressures and demands, is all about.


Once, when I was berating myself for not devoting hours to private prayer and meditation on the Bible, a friend reminded me of the day when Jesus and his disciples were overwhelmed by the demands of the crowd: "Then Jesus entered a house, and again a crowd gathered, so that he and his disciples were not even able to eat." Mark is the only gospel that gives us this glimpse into the pressures of Jesus' ministry. Mark, alone, also recounts the reaction of Jesus' family. When they heard what was going on, they concluded he had gone "out of his mind: and "went to take charge of him." 2

When I get tired, Mark reminds me of the time Jesus was weary from teaching the crowd and fell asleep on a cushion in the back of the boat. He was so exhausted that even a life-threatening storm did not wake him up.³ When I despair about the prospects of the gospel message in this world, Jesus' promise, recorded by Mark, assures me that the seeds of the kingdom of God continue to grow without our toil in ways that we do not understand.⁴

When I feel pulled this way and that, I remember, the time when Jesus was urgently summoned to heal a dying child. While he was going with the distraught father on that urgent mission, he was interrupted by a woman seeking relief from a condition that had afflicted her for years.⁵

By his example, Jesus taught us the proper place of prayer, fasting, and retreat. All of these are important in our spiritual lives. But Mark, shows us that Jesus was also a man of action, reminding us to respond compassionately to needs as we encounter them. He points out the importance of rest and self-care. Mark reminds us that Jesus said, it doesn't all depend on us. Whether we wake or sleep, our faithful efforts are used by God in ways we can never fully understand.

When we were putting the flags back in the sanctuary after the installation of the new carpet, I was thinking about the significance of those symbols in our sanctuary. Since it is June and we celebrate Flag Day this month, it seemed like an appropriate time to write about both of the flags that we see in our sanctuary.

To the left of the lectern stands the flag of the United States of America. Its colors are red, standing for hardiness and valor; white, standing for purity and innocence; blue, standing for vigilance, perseverance, and justice.

To the right of the pulpit stands the flag of Christianity. Its colors are red, standing for Christ's blood sacrifice; white, standing for purity and peace; blue, standing for fidelity.


Thinking about these symbols, I to look at the pledge of allegiance for each of these flags. Perhaps you did not know that there is a pledge to the Christian Flag.

I am going to share with you, both pledges, and let you see the similarities between them. Each has their own meaning, but each is also intertwined with meaning. Yes, the United States is a country of diversity, and many different religious beliefs, but, as a Christian, I see great meaning in both of the pledges, and hope that all of us can stand up for what each challenges us to do in our lives.

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Christian Flag: I pledge allegiance to my flag, and the Savior for whose Kingdom it stands; one Savior, crucified, risen, and coming again, with life and liberty to all who believe.

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America: I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America, and to the republic for which it stands; one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all.

This year on June 14, Flag Day, take time to think about both flags that stand in our sanctuary. The message is clear when looking at both of them. Much has been sacrificed by men and women for the freedoms we enjoy in the United States. And the blood of Jesus was sacrificed to give Christians forgiveness of sin and liberty in eternal life with Him.
