Dear Parishioners,

I usually like to allow Advent to play out before I start talking Christmas. But this Christmas will be a little different, as we know, concerning our Mass set ups. I'm happy to announce that we have 6 Masses this Christmas between our parishes. Three at Sacred Heart and three at St. Joseph.

At this moment I would like to bring your attention to the Nativity play that the school puts on before the 4:30pm Christmas Eve Mass at Sacred Heart. I know we all look forward to seeing baby Jesus and all the Christmas characters at this annual celebration. Knowing this, I plan on allowing anyone to observe this joy filled event so long as we social distance and wear masks. I will allow people to stand throughout the Church socially distanced DURING THE PLAY. The last thing I want to say to someone wishing to see the play is ... "There is no room for you in Church!" Yes I plan on allowing anyone who wants to observe the play to observe. But following the play I will ask anyone who has not found a socially distanced seat in the pews to dismiss from the Church following the play. That being said if you find yourself not in a socially distanced seat you will be asked to leave the Church.

Please do not be alarmed. I know at this point you might be thinking, "What? I can watch the play standing but I can't stay for Mass!? Unbelievable!" Don't worry we have a plan! Even if you can't get a socially distanced seat for the 4:30pm Church Mass you will be kindly invited to the 4:45pm overflow Mass in the gym. There you will have a seat! I hope this overflow Mass will allow everyone to watch the play and give everyone an opportunity to have a seat for either the 4:30 or 4:45 Mass offered on Sacred Heart campus.

Here are some important pointers for the Nativity play and the 4:30pm Church and 4:45pm overflow Mass.

- 1. If you want to watch the play and stay for Mass in the Church you might want to come extra early to ensure you have a socially distanced pew seat.
- 2. Wear a mask if you are able.
- 3. If you find yourself in the socially distanced and standing category for the nativity play... it is likely you will be asked to attend the overflow Mass in the gym.
- 4. If you are willing to usher the nativity play and 4:30pm Mass we would love your services because things might get hectic. Please check in with me prior to Mass starting.
- 5. It is possible that we will have to send people away for the nativity play in order for us to safely social distance. But don't worry if you happen to get turned away from the nativity play you WILL be offered a seat at the 4:45pm overflow Mass.

In conclusion, remember we have 3 Masses at both St. Joe's and Sacred Heart. I think everyone will have the opportunity to celebrate Christmas Mass and no one will get turned away. But let us not all decide to go to the same Mass especially the Nativity play and 4:30pm Mass. The last thing I want to say on Christmas is the harsh words Jesus, Mary and Joseph were told on that cold Christmas night, "There is no room in the inn." Lol.




