- 2. Unless otherwise instructed, only flat buckle or martingale collars or a harness should be used.
- 3. Plenty of small chewy training treats (the size of a kernel of corn) or bite size hotdogs.
- 4. A treat pouch to wear on your waist.

BASIC INFORMATION FOR CLASSES

- <u>1.</u> Feeding before class: Do not feed your dog his regular meal before class. We want the dog to be highly motivated to accept their food rewards.
- Equipment: A flat buckle collar, or a harness, and a six foot or a four foot leash along with a sufficient supply of training treats that your dog will find rewarding. I will supply the clicker. Remember you have to compete with the other things of interest going on for your dog in a new place. So make sure you have something that really gets your dog's attention! Bring a couple of different kinds of small training treats and vary them from week to week.
- <u>3.</u> Walking your dog before class: Try to give your dog a walk before you come to class to give the dog a chance to eliminate. Take your dog outside at any time during class if you feel your dog needs a potty break.
- 4. The benefits of physical exercise prior to class: It is important that your dog come to class ready to give attention and learn. You may find it necessary to take your dog for a walk or some other activity before class. Some physical activity may help take the edge off, which may allow him to focus on you better.
- <u>5.</u> What to do if your dog does "potty" in class: Don't make a fuss over it!
 Supplies will be provided to clean it up.
- <u>6.</u> Cannot make it to class: Please contact me and let me know if you cannot make it to a scheduled class.

- 8. Payment Due at your Orientation or 1st Class if you have previously completed Orientation. Payment in the form of CASH or CHECK only.
