

Community Association Manager Message

Greetings Gardens of Gulf Cove Members: Our maintenance plans are moving along. Most all of the painting will be wrapping up soon. This month we will be concentrating on the concrete deck at the Rec Center Pool. The concrete lippage (toe breakers) have been ground down level with the adjacent surfaces and a hybrid mixture of masonry skimmed over to smooth the surface. We saw cut the slabs where the splaying of concrete was caused by the lack of expansion joints. This was dusty, dusty, work but had to be done to make the area safer and more attractive. The concrete was acid washed in prep for a special paint that will be applied in sections.

The super-chlorination of the Rec-Center pool was successful, 25 gallons of chlorine was added to kill off any stubborn bacteria in the pool. All of the atmospheric black algae was removed from the pool surface. Normally, half the volume of pool water is dumped at this time to remove excess calcium, we did that potion of the annual maintenance last month during a training exercise. The super-chlorination will be done at the clubhouse pool when it is colder.

We have been clearing wild areas in the lakes of the wild grasses and cattails, it may take some time to die off but once cleared the association will maintain them. Invasive plants such as Brazilian Peppers and Carrot wood trees are identified and removal has started. There are numerous Carrot wood trees on the Cutler lots that we will remove throughout the winter months.

In December we will be conducting association finance classes for board members in the clubhouse. The first class will be accrual vs. cash basis of reporting. It will be posted on the bulletin boards and open to all interested owners. Each class will take about one hour and twenty minutes.

I am working with the Board of Directors to expand the key card system to open the Rec Center longer hours without staff present. There are some issues with accessing the rest rooms that we are addressing. I will keep you updated on that.

As with the Thanksgiving holiday, I will be opening the pool and the Rec Center from 10 am to 5 pm on Christmas day while a lot of you have family and guests in town.

On behalf of the staff, we wish all of you a very happy and safe holiday season. Enjoy the weather and all that Florida has to offer.




