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Many of us fear human beings because we are afraid of rejection, exclusion, mockery, harm, among other things. We forget that everything earthly has an end and our lives continue with the Lord. It is God who will determine where we will be according to what we do today.

Am I afraid to profess my faith in public? Am I ready to share my experiences with God with others? Many of us hide behind being considered a "bigot" or "judgmental" and thus fail to express what we believe to others. What Jesus told His disciples is a piece of advice to you and me today, that "What I say to you in the darkness, speak in the light; what you hear whispered, proclaim on the housetops". Many of us have no time to read the Scriptures, reflect on them and share them with others.

We have been subdued by those who believe in all kinds of things and hold on to various ideologies contrary to the teachings of Christ. We are tempted to think that what we believe in and profess is wrong, obsolete and outmoded. Jesus kept alerting His disciples what awaited them in the world: "In the world you will have hardship but be courageous; I have conquered the world" (Jn.16:33b).

There are many things we are afraid of, big ones and small ones. We are afraid of some people and other creatures but most of all, we fear death. Jeremiah experienced death threats and intimidations from his own people. He was sent by God to remind his people of what they were doing wrong, but they denounced him and plotted against him. Even his friends turned against him, and he became their enemy; all because they did not like his message.

But he had faith in God and hoped that his enemies would fail, and they would be put to shame. He believed that the Lord was with him and so he was not afraid. He knew that God rescues the life of the poor from the power of the wicked. He was sure that the wicked would never succeed in his plans to destroy the just one.

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
