✠SAINTS/FEASTS OF THE WEEK✠

Jan 21-St. Agnes-Born to a wealthy Christian family in Rome, St. Agnes' hand in marriage was much sought after, but she always replied that she made a promise to God to never stain her purity. Her repeated rebukes of marriage proposals angered many suiters, and when she turned away the son of the Governor, she was eventually condemned to death.

Jan 23-St. Marianne Cope-A German-born American religious sister, St. Marianne was a member of the Sisters of St Francis of Syracuse, New York, and administrator of its St. Joseph's Hospital in the city. When the Hawaiian government sent out requests for help in running the receiving station for those suspected of having leprosy, St. Marianne and 35 additional sisters volunteered to go, and took charge of the home that Saint Damien de Veuster had established.

Jan 24-St. Francis de Sales-A Bishop of Geneva, St. Francis de Sales was known for his deep faith and gentle approach to the religious divisions created by the Protestant Reformation.

Jan 25-The Conversion of St. Paul the Apostle-Until meeting Jesus on his way from Jerusalem to Damascus, St. Paul the Apostle was a persecutor of early Christians. During the trip, Paul was stopped by a blinding light and a divine voice instructing Paul to stop persecuting him and to go to Damascus and that he would be told what to do.

Jan 26-Sts. Timothy and Titus-Trusted friends of St. Paul, Sts. Timothy and Titus were two of Paul's most loyal companions, disciples and helpers.

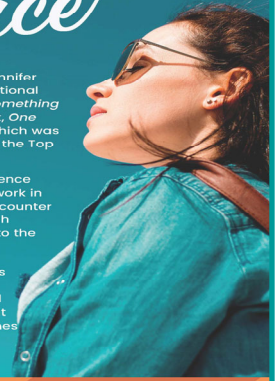

20 de enero de 2019 • Segundo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Hace dos semanas, los cristianos celebramos la Epifanía del Señor, o la manifestación de la luz de Dios en el mundo, en la visita de los magos a Cristo niño. En otros siglos, la boda de Cana también estaba incluida en la Epifanía, al igual que otros eventos, como el bautismo de Jesús e incluso la misma Navidad. Nosotros ahora las hemos separado, celebraciones anuales de la Navidad, los magos y el bautismo de Jesús, pero este Segundo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario en el año C del leccionario, es la única celebración de la boda de Cana. Aun así, imágenes de boda parece dominar la comprensión de la Iglesia de esas otras epifanías, así como las vemos en la antífona que usamos en la Liturgia de las Horas para la Epifanía. Esta antífona se refiere a Cristo como el novio y la Iglesia como la novia, y los magos apurándose a dar sus regalos al matrimonio real. Termina con el júbilo de los invitados a la boda.

LOS SIGNOS EN JUAN—LAS EPIFANÍAS DEL MATRIMONIO REAL

Juan el evangelista describe la conversión de agua en vino en la boda de Cana como “el comienzo” de los signos que

Jesús realizaría para manifestar la gloria de Dios. “El comienzo” aquí significa más que lo primero en una serie. “El comienzo” señala al origen de todos los signos en que el “matrimonio real” de la divinidad y la humanidad en Jesús como la Palabra hecha carne, elevando y transformando todo lo que toca. El vino que Jesús proporciona fue mejor que el agua con previamente había llenado las ánforas, y era mucho mejor que el vino que los invitados ya habían estado tomando.

Los primeros escritores cristianos vieron en esta transformación del agua en vino una anticipación de la transformación de Jesús al vino de su propia sangre. La epifanía en Cana nos muestra cómo hacernos colaboradores en esa gran boda de la divinidad y humanidad. Limpios en las aguas sagradas y divididos en el vino en el que la sangre de Jesús se ha convertido, nosotros también podemos ser transformados en signos del amor glorioso de Dios.

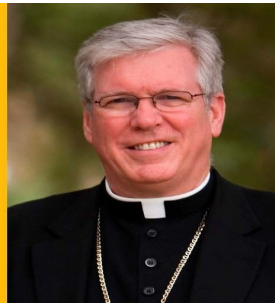

A VISIBLE GOD

We find it difficult to convey ideas to people unless we can actually show them something, demonstrate what we mean. God, who is invisible and truly beyond human understanding, apparently faces the same difficulty. People want to *see*, not just listen to an idea. So God gave us Jesus Christ, God made visible in the world.

During these past weeks we have seen how Jesus was revealed as an infant to the shepherds and the magi, and then began his adult “public life” at his baptism by John. Today’s Gospel reading tells us of his “first sign,” providing wine for the wedding guests at Cana.

Of course, even Jesus, God made visible, was not always easily understood in his own day, nor is he even now. So we have to ponder what we see: the poverty and simplicity of his birth, his humility and openness before John the Baptist, his kindness and compassion toward people in their ordinary problems, such as running short of wine at a wedding. Yet it is in coming to know Jesus that we come to know God. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The cause of church unity is commended to Christians for prayer and action every year around this time. This week is not so much to focus on the many divisions within the Christian family, but on bonds of faith and mission. Even though Christians have always shown an inclination to fracture, spin off, and mutate into new expressions, recent history shows some new points of convergence and agreement. Catholics are more firmly rooted in the word of God, for example, and many Protestants are more likely to celebrate Communion than in years past. Some denominations are merging and pooling resources, and people from various traditions are collaborating on projects.

The call of this week is to be mindful of the diversity of our traditions and customs while treasuring what we hold in common. The old advice to “lighten up” is good medicine, because sometimes our differences are delightful and amusing. If someone says, “Let us pray,” a Catholic might close the eyes, bow the head and fold hands; a Protestant reach out and clasp hands with the person in the next chair; and someone belonging to an Orthodox tradition might stand up with eyes wide open. Each has taken a different path, but the goal is always the same. This is a week not for focusing on the well-worn paths of divergence, but for mutual delight in a common goal. —James Field, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.
