

Grand Inspectors Union at the Royal Albert Hall



The picture records the historic meeting of the four Grand Inspectors together for the first time ever at the Royal Albert Hall during the Tercentenary Celebrations.

There are four Grand Inspectors in the Craft appointed to administer groups of lodges in districts overseas where there are not enough lodges to form a District Grand Lodge. Their duties are similar to District Grand Masters but on a smaller scale.

Grand Inspectors are appointed for two lodges in Malta, three lodges in Montreal and Halifax in Canada, four lodges in Portugal and three lodges in the South West Pacific, which includes Fiji and Vanuatu.
